Sharp allocation update	 Sharp Healthcare (Imperial County) provided an update on allocation of Sharp's extra doses Notified 300 Pfizer doses would be expiring in the next 12 hrs. at 9 AM on Tuesday 12.29.2020 To avoid wasting vaccines, started reaching out to City of San Diego Firefighters and Police Department, was able to receive the all clear to vaccinate 300 staff on both teams before the vaccines expired. Made executive decision to not waste vaccine and found appropriate group (high exposure, essential workers) to vaccinate.
