

How do I get the MenB vaccine?

(Options beyond the vaccination clinics at San Diego State University)

Q: If I have insurance, how can I access the MenB vaccine?

- Step 1: Locate the phone number for your health insurance as well as your member ID number. You can find this information on your insurance card.
- Step 2: Call your health insurance company and ask the following questions:
 - Where can I go to get the MenB vaccine?
 - How much will this cost using my health insurance?
- Step 3: Call health care provider approved by insurance and ask: "Do I need to make an appointment to get this or can I walk-in?"
- Step 4: Before concluding the call, confirm the price, location, and appointment time.

Q: Where can I go if I need help understanding how to access my insurance?

Q: What if I am uninsured and would like to get insurance?

Q: Can I get the MenB vaccine without insurance?

Yes, you have off-campus and on-campus options.

For **off-campus**:

• Step 1: Look up the phone number for a local pharmacy. You can easily find this information via the search function of online services, like Yelp or Google.

- Step 2: Call the pharmacy and ask the following questions:
 - Do you have MenB vaccine available?
 - How much will it cost?
 - Do I need to make an appointment to get this or can I walk-in?
 - You may also want to ask: How much will this cost using my health insurance?
- Step 3: Before concluding the call, confirm price, location, and if an appointment is needed.

For on-campus options:

The MenB vaccine is available at Student Health Services, though the office does not accept insurance. The Bexsero brand MenB vaccine requires two doses, which are administered one month apart and cost \$154 per dose. The Trumenba brand MenB vaccine requires three doses during an outbreak. The second and third doses of Trumenba are administered one and six months, respectively, following the initial dosage. Trumenba costs \$120 per dose.

You have two options for scheduling an appointment:

Option 1: Make an Appointment by Phone

• Call SDSU Student Health Services 8:30 am - 4:30 pm at 619-594-4325 and follow the prompts to make a medical appointment.

Option 2: Make an Appointment Online

- Step 1: Visit https://HealtheConnect.sdsu.edu
- Step 2: If you do not have a username required for login on Healthe Connect, please click on the "register" button at the top right hand side of the login screen.
- Step 3: If you have never visited Student Health Services you must use the email on file with the University to register for HealtheConnect. If you have visited Student Health Services, you must use the email you provided to Student Health Services during your visit.
