
### RYAN WHITE PART A SERVICE CATEGORIES - NUMBER OF CLIENTS SERVED





# Integrated Services for Women, Children, and Families

Ryan White Part A provides services to ensure that women, infants, children and youth living with HIV have access to medical care as well as other services that support successful medical outcomes.

- A holistic, psychosocial approach helps to reduce isolation and build a support network for women, children, and families affected by HIV.
- Coordinated services address the unique needs of this population, ensuring timely entry, access to and retention in the full continuum of HIV care and treatment.

#### Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI)

The Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) provides additional funding to improve access to HIV care and health outcomes for racial and ethnic minority populations disproportionately affected by HIV.

- 370 Ryan White clients utilized one or more MAI-funded services in 2023.
- 70% of MAI clients were Hispanic/Latino,
   23% were Black/African American, and
   2% were Native American/Native
   Hawaiian
