



Editorial Note: Re-launch of Chlamydia and Gonorrhea Home Testing Program, I Know – www.DontThinkKnow.org

In 2013, with support from the California Department of Public Health, the HIV, STD, and Hepatitis Branch (HSHB) of Public Health Services launched I Know, a program that provides free home vaginal test kits for chlamydia and gonorrhea to San Diego County residents under 25 years of age. The website, DontThinkKnow.org, has recently been revamped and relaunched, and users may once again order a free home test kit.

Youth, particularly young women of color, bear a disproportionate burden of chlamydia infections. In 2019, a total of 23,007 cases of chlamydia were reported in San Diego County, 37% of which were among women under 25 years of age. That same year, a total of 6,395 cases of gonorrhea were reported in San Diego County, 16% of which were among women under 25 years of age [1]. Without treatment, both infections can cause pelvic inflammatory disease, tubal scarring, ectopic pregnancy, and infertility.

The United States Preventive Services Task Force issued a Grade B recommendation for screening for chlamydia and gonorrhea in sexually active women aged 24 years and younger (and in older women who are at increased risk for infection)[2]. However, many young women experience barriers to accessing testing, including lack of transportation, lack of a nearby clinic, privacy concerns, or financial burden. I Know addresses many of these barriers by allowing young women to order and complete a free and confidential test in the privacy of their own homes.






Editorial Note (Continued):

The kit can be ordered in English or Spanish from DontThinkKnow.org or via phone by calling (619) 692-KNOW (5669) and can be sent to any address within San Diego County. The kit contains a vaginal swab with instructions for specimen self-collection. Users will receive either a text or e-mail message approximately one week later, letting them know that they can retrieve their results securely online. County staff follow up with all users with positive result(s) to verify treatment or to assist with accessing treatment if needed.
