Health Advisory: Recall of Imported Frozen Organic Strawberries following Hepatitis A Investigation in

Washington State

Key Messages

- Following an investigation of hepatitis A virus (HAV) infections in Washington State, which included the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Scenic Fruit Company, and California Splendor, Inc., specific brands and lots of frozen organic strawberries that were imported from Baja California, Mexico, have been voluntary recalled. Some of these products were sold at locations in San Diego County (SDC).
- Consumers, restaurants, and retailers should check freezers and not sell, serve, or eat recalled frozen organic strawberries. These recalled products should be returned or thrown away.
- As of March 14, 2023, the year-to-date HAV case count is elevated for SDC, but no cases of acute HAV infection in SDC have been linked to these products.
- Report all suspect and confirmed HAV cases to the Epidemiology Unit by faxing a <u>Confidential Morbidity Report</u>,
 but for cases among persons experiencing homelessness (PEH) calling 619-692-8499 (Monday-Friday 8 AM-5 PM),
 or 858-565-5255 (after hours) while the person is still in the healthcare facility is strongly preferred.

Situation

Five Washington State residents who developed <u>acute HAV infections from November 24, 2022 through December 27, 2022</u> reported frozen organic strawberry consumption as an exposure. FDA's traceback investigation led to a common supplier using strawberry producers in Baja California, Mexico. Although the recalls include food retail locations in SDC, as of March 14, 2023, none of the genomic patterns identified among SDC residents match the Washington outbreak strain. Current San Diego County Hepatitis A Cases

The current increased cases of acute HAV infections in San Diego County are not associated with the Washington State outbreak. As of March 14, 2023, SDC is reporting 11 cases of HAV. Seven of these cases are persons experiencing homelessness (PEH); four of those also reported using illicit drugs. These cases have been spread by person-to-person contact and not spread by a food exposure, as seen in Washington State. Actions Requested

- 1. **Consider** postexposure prophylaxis (PEP) in asymptomatic patients reporting consumption of the recalled products in the preceding 14 days. Patients should be advised to dispose of recalled products.
- 2. **Provide** PEP for close contacts of confirmed HAV cases. Detailed information on PEP may be found on the CDPH Hepatitis A Postexposure Prophylaxis Guidance Quicksheet (updated April 2021).
- 3. **Diagnose** HAV infection by ordering HAV IgM serology in individuals with discrete onset of symptoms (e.g., nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, anorexia, fever, malaise, dark urine, light-colored stool, or abdominal pain), and jaundice or elevated liver function tests.
- 4. **Avoid** testing people who have no symptoms or elevated liver function tests, but report eating recalled strawberries. False positive HAV IgM test results are common when asymptomatic people are tested.
- 5. Assess homelessness among suspected HAV cases even if they have no exposure to the recalled products and contact the Epidemiology Program while the cases are still at the healthcare facility by promptly calling 619-692-8499 (Monday-Friday 8 AM-5 PM), or 858-565-5255 (after hours, during weekends, and on County-observed holidays). This will ensure public health staff can interview the patient by phone for a risk history and facilitate serum sample collection for HAV PCR and possible genotyping.
- 6. **Report** suspect and confirmed HAV cases to the Epidemiology Unit by faxing a <u>Confidential Morbidity Report</u> or by calling the above contact numbers.
- 7. **Vaccinate** all persons with an indication for HAV vaccine: Especially PEH and those who use illegal drugs. Providers who do not have HAV vaccine available may direct patients to an immunization clinic at the nearest County Public Health Center.
