
- State mandate




Medi-Cal Enrollment

As of August 2015

- More than 700,000 Medi-Cal beneficiaries in San Diego County.
- ▶ 89% enrolled in a Medi-Cal managed care plan (only 54% in 2011)
- Overall managed care beneficiary increase > 35% in past year
