FY 15-16 OUTCOMES



- **More than 2,000 high risk individuals were screened for TB throughout the County**
- **Housing was provided for 36 infectious patients until rendered no longer communicable**
- **TB exposure investigations were conducted for more than 700 individuals**
- **Conducted Direct Observed Therapy (DOT) for 234 individuals**
- **Provided health screening, referral, and follow-up to 1,797 Refugees attended the RHAP health screening**



- **Expansion of the Directly Observed Therapies (DOT) program electronically (EDOT)**
 - Mitigation strategy: Procure contracts
- **Improve treatment for clients across the border**
 - Mitigation strategy: Expand coverage area
- **Continue to enhance cultural understanding of the new refugee population**
 - Mitigation strategy: collaborate with refugee resettlement agencies
