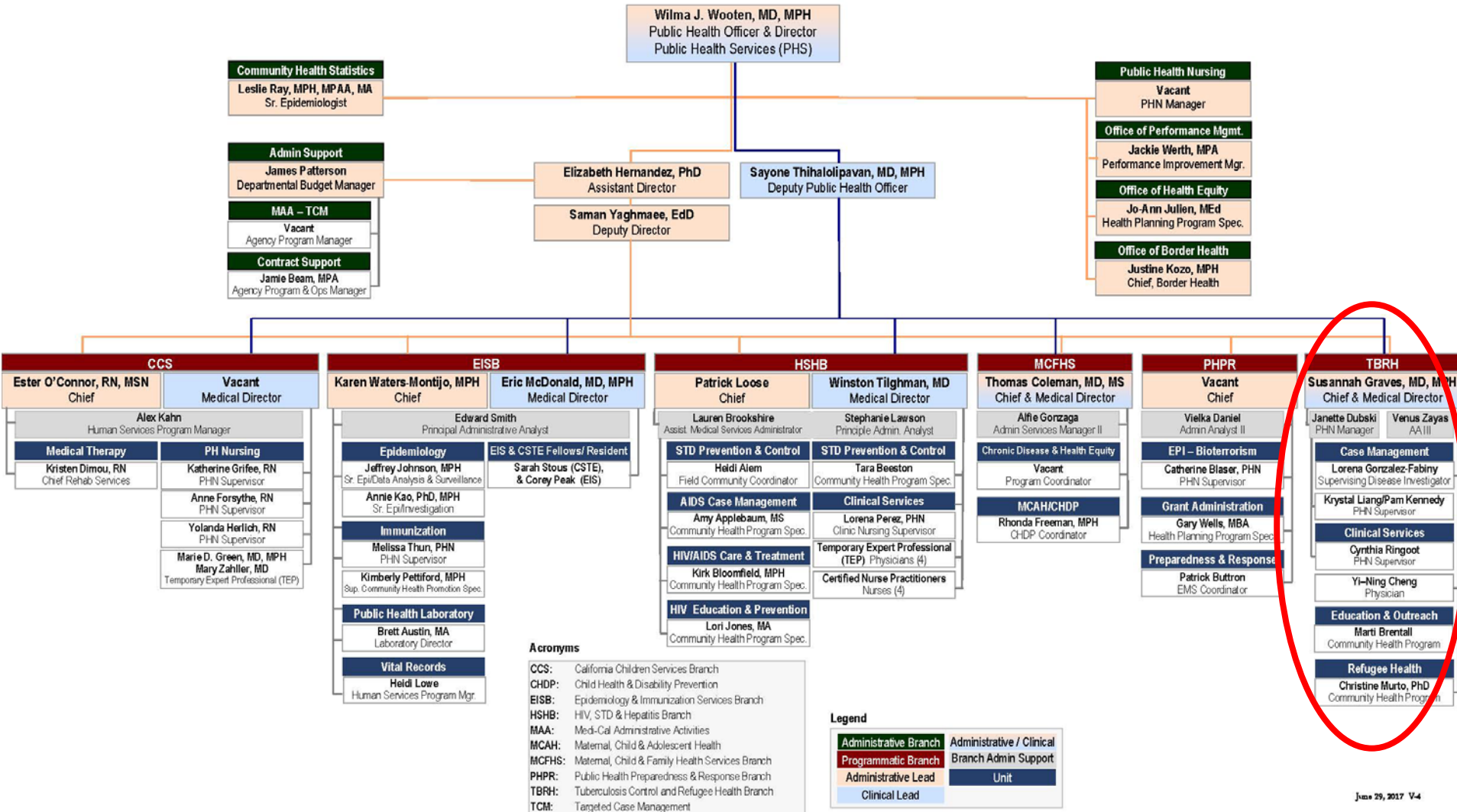

FY 16-17 OUTCOMES



- More than 3,000 high risk individuals were screened for TB throughout the County
- Housing was provided for 49 infectious and non-infectious patients until rendered no longer communicable
- TB exposure investigations were conducted for more than 800 individuals
- Conducted Direct Observed Therapy (DOT) for >250 individuals who were TB cases or suspected cases
- Provided health screening, referral, and follow-up to 2,879 Refugees attended the RHAP health screening
