TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT (TCM) PROVIDER PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT (PPA)

Public Health Services requests HSAB to support the Provider Participation Agreement (PPA) for Targeted Case Management for the period of July 1, 2017, indefinitely until either party terminates the agreement.

- The current revenue agreement with the State of California, Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) expires on June 30, 2017.



- TCM is a federally funded program designed to assist Local Government Agencies and community providers to recoup costs expended to ensure those persons can access Medi-Cal funded services.
- TCM is a comprehensive case management system that works closely with eligible Medi-Cal beneficiaries to ensure they are able to access necessary medical and other supportive services needed to thrive and live healthier lifestyles.
- The new agreement extends participation in this program indefinitely.
- County of San Diego has participated in TCM since the 1990's

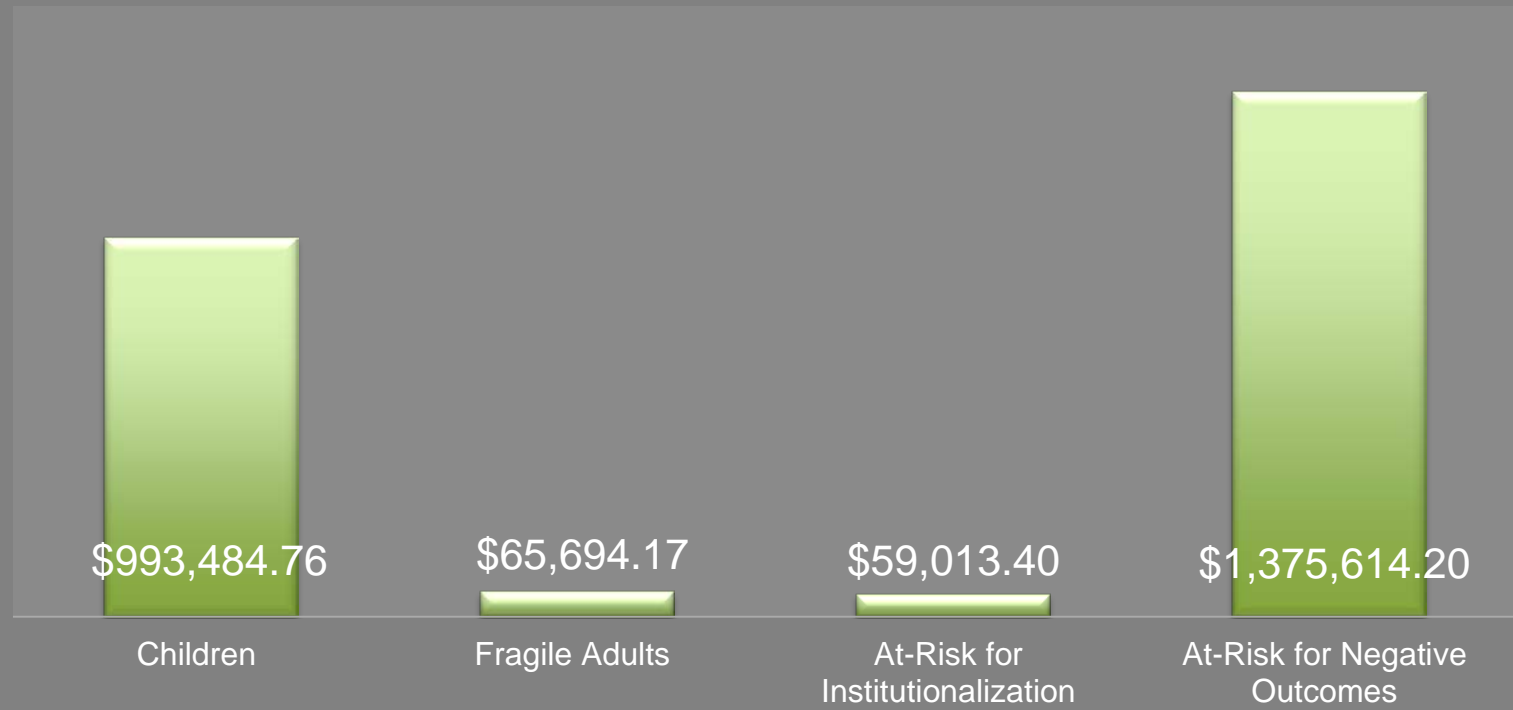
The TCM Activities that are performed by case managers are,

- Assessment and Reassessment
- Care Plan and Periodic Revision
- Referral and Linkage – based on Care Plan
- Monitoring and Follow-Up

COUNTY BENEFIT

- TCM reimbursement funds may be used for any purpose, it is unrestricted revenue
- Participating HHSA programs typically use this revenue to cover the cost of staff and to assist with balancing the annual budget





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
