Tuberculosis (TB) Program






San Diego County, 2024:

- 247 new active TB cases reported
 - 2% increase compared to active cases (242) in 2023
 - 4th consecutive year of rising TB diagnoses since 2021
- Approximately 175,000 latent TB infections

County Services Provided, 2024:

- 7,109 clinical services
- 2,822 unique patients provided clinical care
- 4,884 contacts of active TB cases were identified
- 56 individuals were sheltered in TB housing
- 45 educational trainings provided to 1,281 participants
