





- TBPCB, in collaboration with Sweetwater Union School District (SUHSD), are working to notify students and staff who were potentially exposed to tuberculosis (TB) at Southwest High School from Feb. 1, 2025, to May 22, 2025.
- The school district and County have notified individuals at highest risk of infection.
- No-cost TB screening is being arranged for students and staff who are at increased risk of infection.

Drs. Tweeten and Tilghman are recognized as contributors/authors in the latest publication highlighting the collaborative work on Hepatitis C in our region.


