- The stakeholder meetings continue in order to gather input regarding future program changes. The next LIHP Stakeholder meeting is scheduled for August 29, 2013.
- To date, San Diego has received 647 referrals from the California Department of Health Care Services for State prisoners who are eligible for LIHP.
- A LIHP Transition Team has been established. The first meeting was held on June 10, 2013. Workgroups for Communication and Continuity of Care were established and will be meeting regularly starting late August. Progress of the workgroups will be reported to the Transition Team at the monthly LIHP Stakeholder Meetings. The County is involved in all State LIHP Transition meetings, which are on-going.
- HCPA will be leveraging the 340B Drug Pricing Program, which provides outpatient drugs to eligible healthcare organizations at significantly reduced prices, to support our safety net population and enable the County to stretch resources. Implementation has been delayed until January 1, 2014.
- Starting in January 2013, Healthy Families Program (HFP) beneficiaries started transferring in phases from State administration to County administration. During Phase I, approximately 52,000 HFP beneficiaries have transitioned (beneficiaries with Community Health Group, Kaiser Permanente, Molina Healthcare and Health Net).
- The transition of HFP beneficiaries currently receiving behavioral health treatment went smoothly. Warm hand-offs took place with all seriously emotionally disturbed children (SED), with a total of 810 children receiving behavioral health services transferred; all were accommodated by County BHS and/or a Managed Care Health Plan.

- The next phase is effective 8/1/13 with approximately 10,000 HFP beneficiaries transitioning from Blue Cross to new Managed Care Health Plans.
