Expanded opportunities for low-income individuals, families and communities to access healthy and affordable food options

FAMILY SELF-SUFFICIENCY PROVIDERS



Helped **890** individuals access CalFresh benefits

Provided **2,868** individuals with emergency food assistance

Reached **4,952** individuals through nutrition education

Increased capacity in low-income communities to meet the needs of the high-risk/high-need populations that reside there

137 participants engaged in **12** trainings, including:

Provided training and technical assistance to build the capacity of **4** Ethnic Based Service Organizations

Provided opportunities for low-income youth and their families to engage in activities that support safety and well-being



Placed **50** youth from socially and economically disadvantaged backgrounds in paid work externships

Provided community level support to local law enforcement and other stakeholders to improve safety outcomes

1,666 individuals participated in Alternative Dispute Resolution Services, avoiding conflict escalation

4 Police/Community Trainings in Southeast San Diego to improve law enforcement interactions with residents



2,125 Citizen/Police Officer contacts made in Southeast San Diego through "Walk and Knocks" to help identify community concerns

Increased the number of low-income residents engaged in activities that improve the health, safety and well-being of their communities



Facilitated **6** Resident Leadership Academy Council Meetings, including **128** participants working to support community improvement projects countywide.

Expanded economic enhancement opportunities in low-income communities

Placed **105** Homeless Families in Permanent Housing



Helped **370** Newly Arriving Refugees improve Vocational English Skills to support employment

Provided youth pedestrian and bicycle safety training to **2,176** students countywide to support physical activity and reduce preventable accidents



Co-Led the local Earned Income Tax Credit Coalition, supporting efforts that generated **31,727** federal tax returns, bringing **\$37.1 million** in State and Local refunds, including **\$15.4 million** in EITC dollars to local economy
