George Scolari also suggested a topic regarding the Medi-Cal pharmacy benefit carve out through Magellan. Magellan is reaching out to every health plan to set up a meeting with each health plan's list of providers for a training on how to get prescriptions filled. George suggested that we do this with them collaboratively. It would be treated like any other virtual training the HE/CL Workgroup coordinates by connecting Magellan with Valerie Martinez to have Magellan send the flyer and add the health plan logos on the bottom. It can then be sent out to all our distribution lists, including County BHS. The subcommittee agreed with this suggestion.

- Consumer Center for Health Education & Advocacy (CCHEA)
 -The MSSP carve out will occur in January 2022. The notices will go out 30 days in advance of the change. The Consumer Center is prepared for calls regarding challenges or questions regarding the notice.
 - -Staff at the Consumer Center has been educated to answer questions regarding Medi-Cal's asset test that will be eliminated by July 1, 2022.
 - -There is concern around misinformation regarding the Cal Medi-Connect (CMC) benefit ending, and there are reports of brokers using this misinformation to encourage individuals to move out of CMC and into other options. Staff has been alerted to watch out for this type of misinformation in the community.
- Health Plan Workgroup (HPWG)
 - -The HE/CL Workgroup will create COVID posters to help with vaccine hesitancy.
 - -There was a discussion on Whole Person Wellness (WPW) regarding the plan to transition individuals from WPW into Enhanced Care Management (ECM). The County and health plans will meet individually to discuss the various cases. The goal is to have Exodus or PATH meet with each beneficiary to explain the transition rather than mail any notices.
- San Diego Regional Center Workgroup (SDRC)
 -A meeting will be scheduled at the end of the year. The Executive Director, Carlo Flores, is retiring.
- Community Based Adult Services Ad Hoc Workgroup (CBAS)

 The CBAS Centers continue to offer remote and on-site services. Each center will determine the number of on-site services they will offer and the available capacity.
 The Department of Aging released an All Center Letter in August notifying CBAS that the program attendance requirements of having every member on-site at least once a week by October 31st has been suspended until further notice.

	Blood Lead Screening: Valerie received feedback from the	
	health plans regarding their processes and trainings to	
	improve or increase blood lead screening in children as well as	
	what is being monitored. The next step will be assessing	
	where each health plan is, looking at baseline data, and	
	determining a set of action items. This will assist in the	
	collective determination of a process for target blood	
	screening. Valerie Martinez, Katie McMahon, and Sarah Legg	
	will discuss further offline and invite the health plan QA	
	Directors.	
	Fluoride Varnish: Valerie has not heard back from Nancy Starr,	
	who is leading a program for CDPH to train providers on	
	Fluoride Varnish. Other options discussed by the HE/CL	
	Workgroup include a toolkit instead of a provider training as	
	well as offering creative solutions to inform providers of the	
	requirements and resources or tools to help.
