	staff was reviewed. It was decided to create a matrix	
	of required trainings that each health plan require to	
	determine overlap. The matrix will be developed,	
	initially keeping the State requirements in mind. The	
	HE/CL Workgroup is responsible for provider	
	trainings. The Learning Management System logistics	
	will need further investigation. Additional discussion	
	needs to include how to track providers that haven't	

completed trainings and further training logistics,
across the system to ensure/determine that one
standard training could meet each health plans
requirements. Once the matrix is compiled with the
requirements and the mode of training that takes
place by plan, then a representative from each plan
will be able to speak with on their individual training
requirements.
QI Topics
-Application of fluoride varnish within the pediatric
setting, we're going to try to compound and build on
Nancy Starr's Oral Health program efforts. The
fluoride varnish application is now a state priority.

Managed Care accountability is set so we're going to begin to look at those very closely and we'll continue

our quality improvement work.

## **Behavioral Health Subcommittee**(George Scolari)

• Behavioral Health met, with almost 60 participants and Dr Esposito, gave a presentation on population health at the county. She's the Chief Population Health Officer under Behavioral Health Services. Judith Yates is now retired from the hospital association but gives updates on the Behavioral Health Advisory Board. Behavior Health had a discussion on Medi-Cal RX which was implemented January 1 and that's the statewide single vendor for all beneficiaries. Tabitha Lang gave a PowerPoint presentation that taught us the different types of coding they use, depending on what kind of contract. The state wants one screening tool throughout the state. She shared with us a document that was designed for the Student of Behavioral Health Incentive Payment Program and we have a new task force called Student Behavioral Health Incentive Program Task Force. George is leading the group and it's relating to \$28 million. Seven health plans will be receiving enhance Student Behavioral Health in schools but it's not to provide mental health or behavioral health, it is to enhance services like IT. 10% of the unified school districts must agree to participate in order for us to draw down those funds.

Those enrolled in Managed Care total 839,197 and total Medi-Cal enrollment is 935,768. There are 89.7% enrolled in Managed Care.</li> <li>The default rate for San Diego is 42.4% and 38.7% statewide.</li> <li>Eligibility data for January 2022 shows. Calfresh is up overall 7.54% and CalWORKS recipients are seeing an increase of 6.05% from last year. Welfare to work participants, is also up 26.14% from last year. CMS is down 50.00% from last year.</li> </ul>
