





What is it?

MPIP is a temporary immigration status that allows certain family members of U.S. military personnel to remain in the United States while their applications for permanent residency are being processed.

Who is eligible?

- Spouse or unmarried child (under 21 years old) of a U.S. citizen serving on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces.
- Spouse or unmarried child of a U.S. Lawful Permanent Resident serving on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces.
- Surviving spouse or unmarried child of a U.S. service member who died while on active duty or as a result of a service-connected disability.

What are the benefits?



Remain in the U.S

Allows eligible family members to remain in the U.S. while their permanent residency applications are being processed.



Work Authorization

Provides work authorization, allowing eligible family members to work in the U.S.



Travel

Allows eligible family members to travel outside the U.S. and return using advance
