 - city/county/state/federal (18%) facilities.







Health System Strain

- Pre-pandemic the baseline number of patients awaiting discharge from hospitals to skilled nursing facilities (SNFs) was 70-100 on a daily basis.
- During the pandemic and now postpandemic phase, the number of patients awaiting discharge from hospitals to SNFs is 250-300 on a daily basis.

Approximately 80% of the patients awaiting discharge to SNF are enrolled in a Medi-Cal Managed Care Plan.

COSD Public Health created the Long-Term Care Taskforce which has been meeting since the pandemic started with key stakeholders from the county, state programs, hospitals, SNFs, CAHF, etc.

Health system stress and throughput from ED to post-acute care or community care continues to be an issue throughout our region and the state.

Dear Chairwoman Vargas,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB). During the on-going COVID-19 Public Health Crisis, the Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) provided various waivers and flexibilities to states that helped facilitate enrollment and retention into the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), also known as CalFresh in California. The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 that was signed by President Biden into law on December 29, 2023 cut funding and provisions that were providing enhanced SNAP benefits and eligibility to program recipients.

As a result of these cuts, all CalFresh recipients in California are seeing a reduction in their CalFresh monthly allotment amounts as of April 1, 2023, in addition college student eligibility will also be impacted starting June 10, 2023, thus creating additional barriers for this population from accessing the CalFresh program.

There are two legislative bills running through the California Legislature this session which if passed, can help reduce the impact on households receiving the minimum monthly CalFresh allotment and college students.

Senate Bill (SB) 600 proposes increasing the minimum monthly CalFresh allotment amount to \$50, which currently can be as low as \$23 for certain households. This proposal would utilize State General Fund revenue to pay for the enhanced benefits and each \$1 spent in CalFresh benefits generates up to \$1.80 in economic activity. Not only would this bill help reduce the continued food insecurity that hundreds of thousands of San Diegans face, but it would also help generate the local economy.

Assembly Bill (AB) 274 would exempt sources of financial aid income from counting against eligible college students applying for both CalWORKs and CalFresh, in addition to exempting the requirement to verify these sources of income. Given the number of college students in San Diego County, the passage of this bill would help facilitate continued eligibility and enrollment for this population after the federal college student pandemic flexibilities end on June 10, 2023.

For the reasons indicated above, we request San Diego County actively support both SB 600 and AB 274. As Chair of the SSAB, I am writing to recommend that the San Diego Board of Supervisors actively support this request.

An act to add Section 18901.26 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to CalFresh.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 600, as introduced, Menjivar. California CalFresh Minimum Benefit Adequacy Act of 2023.

Existing federal law provides for the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), known in California as CalFresh, under which supplemental nutrition assistance benefits allocated to the state by the federal government are distributed to eligible individuals by each county. Existing law sets maximum allotment amounts by household size. Existing law, until July 1, 2024, requires the State Department of Social Services to create the Safe Drinking Water Supplemental Benefit Pilot Program to provide time-limited additional CalFresh nutrition benefits to residents of prioritized disadvantaged communities that are served by public water systems that consistently fail to meet primary drinking water standards.

This bill would, by January 1, 2025, require the department to establish the CalFresh Minimum Nutrition Benefit (MNB) Program to provide a household with a monthly CalFresh allotment of less than a minimum monthly benefit, established by the bill to be \$50, with an additional state-funded monthly MNB that is equal to the difference between their monthly CalFresh allotment and \$50. The bill would require the department to annually adjust the minimum monthly benefit amount, as prescribed, and would require these benefits to be delivered through the electronic benefits transfer (EBT) system. By imposing

additional duties on counties administering the program, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: yes.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- SECTION 1. This act shall be known, and may be cited, as the California CalFresh Minimum Benefit Adequacy Act of 2023.
- 3 SEC. 2. The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:
- 4 (a) One in five Californians suffers from food insecurity.

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- 5 (b) The federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), known as CalFresh in California, is the most important defense against hunger, helping millions of Californians prevent hunger and its long-term consequences.
 - (c) CalFresh not only helps prevent hunger among low-income households, it also creates jobs and supports our food economy across the state. Each \$1 in CalFresh benefits spent generates between \$1.50 and \$1.80 in economic activity.
 - (d) During the COVID-19 pandemic, most CalFresh households received a temporary boost in CalFresh benefits through federally authorized emergency allotments. When those benefits expire in February 2023, households will face drastic reductions in their monthly benefits. The state should act to mitigate further spikes in hunger and hardship.
 - (e) Four in five CalFresh households include either a child, an older adult, or an individual with a disability, and 81 percent of CalFresh households have a gross monthly income less than or equal to the federal poverty level.
- 23 (f) The CalFresh minimum allotment for one- and two-person 24 households is \$23 per month in the 2022–23 federal fiscal year, 25 while the United States Department of Agriculture estimates,

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- through their Thrifty Food Plan, that the cost of food for a family of two is over \$480 per month.
 - (g) Nationally, one in five SNAP households receive between the minimum allotment and \$50 per month, while over one in three households with an older adult are in this benefits range.
- (h) The cost of living in California is the third highest of any state in the country, after Hawaii and Washington, DC.
- (i) It is therefore the intent of the Legislature that, to prevent hunger and provide a more dignified safety net, no California household should receive less than \$50 per month in benefits, adjusted for inflation.
- SEC. 3. Section 18901.26 is added to the Welfare and Institutions Code, to read:
- 18901.26. (a) The department shall establish the CalFresh Minimum Nutrition Benefit (MNB) Program to provide additional state-funded CalFresh nutrition benefits to ensure all CalFresh households receive a minimum monthly benefit.
- (b) (1) The department shall use funds appropriated for this section to provide all eligible households a state-funded monthly MNB that is equal to the difference between the household's federally funded monthly CalFresh allotment and the minimum monthly benefit established in subdivision (c).
- (2) For purposes of this section, "eligible household" means a household that is approved to receive a federally funded monthly CalFresh allotment that is less than the minimum monthly benefit established in subdivision (c).
- (c) The minimum monthly benefit is fifty dollars (\$50). The department shall annually adjust the minimum monthly benefit according to the procedures developed pursuant to Section 273.10 (e)(4) of Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- (d) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the federal and state laws and regulations governing the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Chapter 51 (commencing with Section 2011) of Title 7 of the United States Code) shall also govern the program provided for under this section.
- (2) Benefits granted pursuant to this section shall be delivered through the electronic benefits transfer (EBT) system created pursuant to Sections 10072 and 10072.2.
- (e) The benefits authorized pursuant to this section are entitlement benefits.

- 1 (f) This section shall become operative by January 1, 2025.
- SEC. 4. If the Commission on State Mandates determines that 2
- this act contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code. 3

An act to add Sections 11250.5 and 18901.09 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public social services.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 274, as introduced, Bryan. CalWORKs: CalFresh: eligibility: income exclusions.

Existing federal law provides for allocation of federal funds to eligible states through the federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant program. Existing state law provides for the California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) program under which, through a combination of state and county funds and federal funds received through the TANF program, each county provides cash assistance and other benefits to qualified low-income families. Under existing law, certain types of payments received by recipients of aid under the CalWORKs program, including, among others, an award or scholarship provided by a public or private entity to, or on behalf of, a dependent child are exempt from consideration as income for purposes of determining eligibility and aid amount.

Existing federal law provides for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), known in California as CalFresh, under which supplemental nutrition assistance benefits allocated to the state by the federal government are distributed to eligible individuals by each county. Existing law requires the eligibility of households to be determined to the extent permitted by federal law. Existing federal regulation provides states with the option to exclude, for purposes of

calculating a household's income under SNAP, any type of income that the state excludes when determining eligibility or benefits for TANF cash assistance.

This bill would exempt any grant, award, scholarship, loan, or fellowship benefit provided to any assistance unit member for educational purposes from consideration as income for purposes of determining CalWORKs eligibility or grant amounts. The bill would also require the State Department of Social Services to exercise a federal option to exclude, for purposes of calculating a household's income under CalFresh, any type of income that the department excludes when determining eligibility or benefits for CalWORKs. This bill would require the department to implement these provisions through an all-county letter or similar instruction until regulations are adopted. By expanding the scope of eligibility for CalWORKs and CalFresh, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

Existing law continuously appropriates moneys from the General Fund to defray a portion of county costs under the CalWORKs program.

This bill would provide that the continuous appropriation would not be made for purposes of implementing the bill.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: yes.





Dear Chairwoman Vargas,

The Social Services Advisory Board's (SSAB) Charter is to review and evaluate Social Services and Self-Sufficiency Services (the "Department") policies, programs, and budgets, recommend means of improving services and facilities, serve as a sounding board for the County of San Diego Health & Human Services Agency ("HHSA") and where appropriate, submit to the Board of Supervisors recommendations concerning the Agency budget practices.

The SSAB would like to commend the Department on their dedication to continuously enhance service delivery and access to public assistance benefits and their improvement of customer service over the last decade.

In 2010, the Board of Supervisors sent a memo to the Chief Administrative Officer requesting that the SSAB address the efficiency and effectiveness of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program ("SNAP"), now known as CalFresh. The SSAB established a time-limited working group comprised of community-based organizations that had experience working with SNAP to provide recommendations for simplifying the eligibility process and removing perceived barriers that impede program participation. This resulted in 69 recommendations provided to the Department to implement.

During this time period, San Diego County was one of the lowest performing counties in the state. The Department found itself under multiple State Corrective Action Plans. These included, CalFresh for poor performance and negative error rate, Medi-Cal for failure to comply with federal mandates in the completion of timely and accurate renewals, and Income and Eligibility Verification for not meeting processing timelines.

While progress was made on the implementation of the 69 recommendations, including work culture and morale, to more specific system-oriented suggestions to improve application processing and customer service, there was still much more to be done. Below is a snapshot of key metrics during FY 2010/2011:

- Access Call Center, average wait time for the year was 4:59:51 (hours)
- Access Call Center received 684K calls with 35% abandoned calls
- CalFresh timeliness was not met
- Medi-Cal timeliness was not met
- SSS received high number of customer complaints and poor customer service feedback

Since then, the Department has continued to make improvements despite the challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. In fact, the improvements to systems allowed the Department to

pivot quickly and maintain customer service at the start and during the pandemic. The Department has been firmly committed to sustain its work with SSAB and the community to improve the health and well-being of those being served, including recruiting an auspicious, knowledgeable and dynamic leadership team. In addition, as directed by your Board of Supervisors in 2021, the Eligibility Task Force ("ETF") was created to further assess barriers to eligibility enrollment and identify additional operational efficiencies to make the programs accessible to all eligible in San Diego County (Report Link). The SSAB looks forward to working with the Department on the implementation of the twenty-four (24) recommendations. In fact, the ETF consultants not only provided recommendations, they also recognized that the Department had implemented best practices in a number of areas that heighten customer service and operational efficiency.

As a result of the decade long efforts, there has been a dramatic improvement in key performance metrics and customer service. Below is a snapshot of the some of the current key performance metrics:

- Total number of calls received at Access Call Center was 1.8M last FY (over 165% increase)
- Access Call Center abandoned calls is at 2%
- Access Call Center average wait time is 1:06 (minutes)
- CalFresh program has over 373,000 recipients (115.1% increase)
- CalFresh program is meeting state and federal standards for timely processing and accuracy
- Medi-Cal program has 1,023,000 recipients (187.8% increase)
- Medi-Cal program is meeting state and federal standards for timely processing and accuracy
