- 3. Public Comments:
 - No public comment

- 4. Presentation Item: Recovery Action Fund for Tomorrow (RAFT) Program: Khea Pollard, Director of Economic Mobility and Opportunity, Jewish Family Service San Diego. Ms. Pollard presented an overview of one of the JFS Economic Mobility and Opportunity Department's programs called the Recovery Action Fund for Tomorrow (RAFT) Program, in partnership with the County of San Diego. She provided information on the program's goals to provide support and relief, by distributing a one-time unconditional payment of \$4,000 to families, seniors, and individuals at risk of homelessness in the community.
- 5. Information Item: Review Legislative Advocacy Bills that Support SSAB Strategic Priorities: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Elayyat shared a draft letter of support to the Board of Supervisors for Senate Bill 1355, in which the SSAB Members voted to advocate for in the previous meeting. She also shared a letter that was sent to the State from Chairwoman Vargas, in regards to the budget requests from the County of San Diego.
- 6. **Information Item:** Update on Medi-Cal Renewals, PHE Lift for Public Assistance Programs, Waivers, Enrollment, Service Delivery, Data: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Elayyat provided quick updates for CalFresh and CalWORKs programs, focusing mainly on Medi-Cal Renewal data and provided updates on a variety of monthly reports. She also shared an update on the Disaster CalFresh, highlighting that Self-Sufficiency Services received over 19,000 applications and issued over \$6 million in benefits.







Prices increased nearly 20% since early 2021, creating financial stress





State Personal Income Tax Revenue








STATEWIDE SALES TAX

Sales tax drives HHSA realignment revenue: \$879.2M, 25.5% of HHSA's Budget






STATE BUDGET OUTLOOK







Dear Chairwoman Vargas,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB). In an effort to support San Diego County's most vulnerable residents and eliminate barriers to Public Assistance program enrollment and retention, I would like to highlight Senate Bill (SB) 1355 for the San Diego County Board of Supervisors to support.

The In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) program administered by the Health & Human Services Agency provides qualified elderly, blind, and disabled residents with supportive services that allow them to remain in their homes. In addition, IHSS helps reduce the need for more expensive Medi-Cal Long Term Care facility services. Certain individuals eligible to receive the Medi-Cal program may also be eligible to receive IHSS services. As a condition of Medi-Cal eligibility, federal regulations and state law require beneficiaries of the program to complete an annual redetermination process. During this process beneficiaries can become disenrolled from both Medi-Cal and IHSS if they do not provide the necessary paperwork and verifications to the County. Because IHSS beneficiaries are elderly, blind, or disabled, their financial circumstances generally do not fluctuate drastically from one year to the next, therefore Medi-Cal eligibility exists.

SB 1355 would allow for IHSS recipients to complete a Medi-Cal redetermination once every three years, rather than once every year. By reducing the frequency of the Medi-Cal redetermination, IHSS recipients would be less likely to lose their Medi-Cal benefits and IHSS eligibility. This would help greatly reduce barriers to medical care for IHSS recipients, as well as ensure greater fiscal responsibility with tax dollars while also reducing administrative costs and burden.

For the reasons indicated above, we request San Diego County actively support SB 1355. As Chair of the SSAB, I am writing to recommend that the San Diego Board of Supervisors actively support this request.

I am writing to you on behalf of the Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB). In an effort to reduce the risk of electronic benefit theft that has impacted San Diego County's most vulnerable residents and reduce unnecessary spending to address electronic theft, I would like to highlight Assembly Bill (AB) 2141 for the San Diego County Board of Supervisors to support.

Cash assistance programs including Cash Assistance for Aged, Blind, and Disabled Immigrants (CAPI), California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) are administered by the County on behalf of the California Department of Social Services. These programs are vital in ensuring our most vulnerable residents are able to meet their basic needs for shelter, clothing, and other essential necessities. Under existing law, cash benefits are issued through the statewide Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) system, but for cash benefits, recipients can choose to have funds directly deposited into a qualified account of their choice.

AB 2141 would require statewide adoption of allowing for CalWORKs, CAPI, and General Relief issuance through direct deposit and require that applications for cash assistance programs to include information on the application regarding an applicant's right to receive their benefits through direct deposit or be issued on an EBT card. This bill would also require Counties to inform recipients of their options during their redetermination for eligibility which occurs once every 12 months. San Diego County has already implemented this practice and by allowing customers across the State of California the option to opt for direct deposit for cash assistance, this significantly reduces the risk of electronic benefit theft. Additionally, bill will reduce administrative costs associated with addressing EBT theft occurrences, as well as ensure greater fiscal responsibility with tax dollars.

For the reasons indicated above, I request San Diego County actively support AB 2141. As Chair of the SSAB, I am writing to recommend that the San Diego Board of Supervisors actively support this request.

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE—2023–24 REGULAR SESSION

ASSEMBLY BILL

No. 2241

Introduced by Assembly Member Alvarez

February 8, 2024

An act to add Section 10504 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public social services.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2241, as amended, Alvarez. Public social services: reporting and verification.

Existing law provides for various public social services programs administered by the State Department of Social Services, State Department of Health Care Services, and counties, including, among others, the California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) program, under which each county provides cash assistance and other benefits to qualified low-income families and individuals, CalFresh, under which supplemental nutrition assistance benefits allocated to the state by the federal government are distributed to eligible individuals by each county, and the Medi-Cal program, under which qualified low-income individuals receive health care service. Existing law imposes various reporting and verification requirements on applicants and recipients of these public social services programs relating to identity, income, and assets, among other things.

This bill would, to the extent permitted under federal law and no later than January 1, 2026, law, require state and county agencies to accept the reporting by an applicant or recipient of public social services of any lawfully required information, changes, and verification required by law that affect eligibility and benefit amounts, by any means available

to the applicant or recipient, including, but not limited to, reported in person, by telephone, through facsimile, by email, or by any other electronic means. The bill would require county agencies to meet specified software security requirements on or before January 1, 2026. The bill would require a county agency to accept reporting by any means available to an applicant or recipient prior to January 1, 2026, if the county agency uses software that meets those requirements. or by secure electronic means, as specified. The bill would require a state or county agency that receives information in an unsecure manner to immediately inform the applicant or recipient of the privacy concern and provide a reasonable alternative method for resubmitting the information. The bill would require the State Department of Social Services and the State Department of Health Care Services to implement this provision these provisions through all-county letters, provider bulletins or notices, policy letters, or similar instructions from the director of each department issued no later than July 1, 2025. To the extent this bill expands eligibility for county administered programs and by imposing additional duties on counties, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

Existing law continuously appropriates moneys from the General Fund to defray a portion of county costs under the CalWORKs program.

This bill would instead provide that the continuous appropriation would not be made for purposes of implementing the bill.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that with regard to certain mandates no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

With regard to any other mandates, this bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs so mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: yes.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 10504 is added to the Welfare and 2 Institutions Code, to read:

-3— AB 2241

10504. (a) (1) No later than January 1, 2026, notwithstanding *Notwithstanding* any other law and to the extent permitted under federal law, state and county agencies shall accept the reporting by an applicant or recipient of public social services provided under this division of any lawfully required information, changes, and verification required by law that affect eligibility and benefit amounts, by any means available to the applicant or recipient, including, but not limited to, in person, by telephone, through facsimile, by email, or by any other electronic means. the following means:

- (1) In-person reporting.
- 12 (2) By telephone.

- (3) By facsimile.
- (4) By electronic means if submitted through a secure and encrypted method that permits the state or county agency, or client, access to the information, changes, or verification after submission.
- (2) A county agency shall accept reporting pursuant to paragraph (1) prior to January 1, 2026, if the county agency uses software that meets the requirements of subdivision (b).
- (b) On or before January 1, 2026, a county agency shall use software designed to do both of the following:
- (1) Prevent, detect, search, and remove viruses and other types of malware from computers and networks.
 - (2) Send and receive emails securely.
- (b) If a state or county agency receives information in an unsecure manner, the state or county agency shall immediately, upon receipt, inform the applicant or recipient of the privacy concern and provide a reasonable alternative method for resubmitting the information.
- SEC. 2. Notwithstanding the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code), the State Department of Social Services and the State Department of Health Care Services shall implement this act through all-county letters, provider bulletins or notices, policy letters, or similar instructions from the director of each department issued no later than July 1, 2025.
- SEC. 3. No appropriation pursuant to Section 15200 of the Welfare and Institutions Code shall be made for purposes of this act.

AB 2241 — 4—

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1 SEC. 4. To the extent that this act has an overall effect of 2 increasing certain costs already borne by a local agency for programs or levels of service mandated by the 2011 Realignment 3 4 Legislation within the meaning of Section 36 of Article XIII of the California Constitution, it shall apply to local agencies only to 5 the extent that the state provides annual funding for the cost 7 increase. Any new program or higher level of service provided by 8 a local agency pursuant to this act above the level for which funding has been provided shall not require a subvention of funds by the state or otherwise be subject to Section 6 of Article XIII B 10 11 of the California Constitution.

However, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that this act contains other costs mandated by the state, reimbursement to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

Each May, the State of California and County of San Diego join community partners in celebrating CalFresh Awareness Month.

It is an opportunity to promote this resource to families and provide those who qualify with access to healthy, nutritious food.

Dozens of community events are scheduled throughout the month to share information about CalFresh and offer free, in-person help to eligible people and families. A full list of the free events is available online on the County's **CalFresh** website.

"Enrollment is at a record high, so we know we have great need in our community right now," said Rick Wanne, director of County Self-Sufficiency Services. "Our priority is to make sure everyone eligible signs up to receive this nutritious benefit."

CalFresh is California's federal food assistance program, the state's version of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. It is designed to increase access to fresh and healthy food. The program also aligns with the County's Live Well San Diego commitment to healthy, safe, and thriving communities.

Over the past decade CalFresh enrollment has increased by 68 percent. As of April 1, 2024, it was serving 396,964 San Diegans. This is up 5.6 percent from last year.
