- 1. Meeting called to order at 9:35 by Chair, Vino Pajanor.
- 2. The August 14, 2023 Meeting Minutes were approved, with all Board Members present voting yes.
- 3. Public Comments:
 - No public comment
- 4. **Information Item:** Overview of Serving Seniors San Diego: Paul Downey, President and CEO, Serving Seniors. Mr. Downey presented an overview of Serving Seniors, including statistics and the demographics they serve. He shared the services they provide, including meals, case management, activities/civic engagement, affordable housing, and homelessness services.

- 5. **Information Item:** Review Legislative Advocacy Bills that Support SSAB Strategic Priorities: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Elayyat shared a letter from Chairwoman Nora Vargas regarding the Farm Bill and SNAP as well as some additional information if the Farm Bill expires.
 - A public comment was made by Mauricio Medina, Public Affairs Manager of San Diego Hunger Coalition, sharing that in regards to a question from an SSAB Board Member about outreach activities in rural areas, the Hunger Coalition has released its Federal Policy priorities tracking all of the marker bills that hopefully have enough support and the provisions of those marker bills will be rolled up into the big legislative vehicle that is the Farm Bill, including the Food Deserts Act (HR 1230). He also thanked Assmaa and team for tracking the State legislative process and for all the advocacy as the legislative session in Sacramento wraps up.
- 6. Information Item: Update on PHE Lift for Public Assistance Programs, Waivers, Enrollment, Service Delivery, Data: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Elayyat shared updates on program flexibilities and PHE unwinding waivers for CalFresh and Medi-Cal programs only, with no update on the CalWORKs program. She shared an update on the continuation of the Medi-Cal renewal processing that started back in April 2023, including partnering with health plans and outreach efforts to determine and extend eligibility.

OVERVIEW

In accordance with San Diego County Board of Supervisors (Board) Policy A-76, Sunset Review Process, the County of San Diego (County) Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) periodically reviews County Administrative Code and Board Policy to ensure policies reflect current Board standards and practices.

Today's actions seek Board approval to amend provisions in the San Diego County Administrative Code relating to the General Relief Program and extend the Sunset Review date; and determine no change is necessary to Board Policy A-128, Comprehensive Homeless Policy and approve the Sunset Review date.

The ordinance makes non-substantive changes to remove language that is not currently used in California law. It will be introduced to the Board on November 7, 2023, and if approved, will be scheduled for adoption on December 5, 2023. If the proposed ordinance is altered on December 5, 2023, a subsequent meeting date will be selected for the ordinance's adoption.

This item supports the County's vision of a just, sustainable, and resilient future for all, specifically those communities and populations in San Diego County that have been historically underserved as well as our ongoing commitment to the regional *Live Well San Diego* vision of healthy, safe, and thriving communities. This will be accomplished as the County Administrative Codes and Board Policies provide a framework for a county that is healthy, safe, and thriving. Additionally, in alignment with the Board's commitment to transparency and open government, the Sunset Review process is an opportunity for HHSA to reflect on current policies through an equity lens and recommend changes that allow for greater transparency.

On November 7, 2023:

1. Approve the introduction of the Ordinance (first reading):

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE RELATING TO THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY GENERAL RELIEF PROGRAM

2. Determine no change is necessary to Board Policy A-128, Comprehensive Homeless Policy and approve the Sunset Review date of December 31, 2030.

If on November 7, 2023, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors takes action as recommended, then on December 5, 2023:

1. Consider and adopt (second reading):

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE RELATING TO THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY GENERAL RELIEF PROGRAM

2. Update the Sunset Review date of the San Diego County Administrative Code, Article XV-C, General Relief Program, to December 31, 2030.

EQUITY IMPACT STATEMENT

As part of standard practice, the County of San Diego (County) Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) performs an annual review of Board Policies and County Administrative and Regulatory Codes that are sunsetting to ensure alignment with current San Diego County Board of Supervisors (Board) values and to ensure that they are updated to reflect applicable laws and regulations. In alignment with the Board's commitment to transparency and open government, the Sunset Review process is an opportunity for HHSA to reflect on current policies through an equity lens and recommend changes that allow for greater transparency.

The changes recommended support the Board's framework toward achieving better outcomes for consumers. The recommended changes regarding Article XV-C, General Relief Program, reflect the County's priority in supporting policies that address disparities and disproportionality and ensure access for all through a fully optimized health and social service delivery system and upstream strategies.

Future Sunset Reviews will continue to utilize an equity lens and a quantitative data-driven approach. Additionally, it is anticipated that these actions will have a positive impact on equity-seeking groups including, Black, Indigenous, people of color, women, people with disabilities, immigrants, youth, and the LGBTQ+ community.

SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT STATEMENT

Today's actions strive for programs and operations that reflect the County of San Diego's (County) values and priorities. By aligning with the County's Sustainability Goals, the changes reflect more equitable, sustainable, and impactful practices. Specifically, extending the Sunset Review date for Board Policy A-128, Comprehensive Homeless Policy, aligns with Sustainability Goal #1 engaging the community in meaningful ways, by investing in community-centered approaches and collaborative leadership to address homelessness. Board Policy A-128 also aligns with Sustainability Goal #2, providing just and equitable access to County services and resources by prioritizing services for individuals who are experiencing homelessness and are part of a particularly vulnerable populations.

Today's action related to Article XV-C, General Relief Program, supports the County's Sustainability Goal #2, by continuing to focus investments on chronically underserved communities, and investing in resilience in vulnerable populations. By updating the sunset date of this ordinance, this action continues to align available County resources with services to maintain fiscal stability and ensure long-term solvency as well as creates policies to reduce poverty, promoting economic sustainability for all. In addition, amendments will ensure the capability to respond and recover to immediate needs for individuals in the region.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with the recommendations. There will be no change in net general fund costs and no additional staff years.

BACKGROUND

In accordance with San Diego County Board of Supervisors (Board) Policy A-76, Sunset Review Process, the County of San Diego (County) Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) periodically reviews Board Policies and the County Administrative Code and Regulatory Code. Revisions to Board Policies and the County Administrative Code are recommended to reflect current Board standards and practices and to reflect any changes in laws, policies and regulations that govern County departmental operations and services.

Sunset Review of Article XV-C

Effective January 1, 2022, the State of California removed all references to the word "alien" in California state statutes. Assembly Bill 1096 (2021) states:

SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this measure to make only non-substantive changes that remove the dehumanizing term "alien" from all California code sections. Nothing in this measure shall be interpreted to make any substantive change to existing law, including, but not limited to, eligibility for federal programs or benefits that are available to a person who meets the definition of "alien" under state or federal law.

The proposed revisions to Administrative Code, Article XV-C, General Relief Program, will align with California law by removing the word "alien" in Section 264 and the title of Section 265. The changes in this Ordinance are non-substantive and are not intended to not expand or reduce eligibility criteria or requirements.

The next Sunset Review date is proposed to be December 31, 2030.

Sunset Review of Board Policy A-128

No changes are requested to Board Policy A-128, Comprehensive Homeless Policy, except for updating the Sunset Review date to December 31, 2030. Board Policy A-128 was revised per Board direction on April 6, 2021 (6) and those revisions were adopted by the Board on February 8, 2022 (1). County Department of Homeless Solutions and Equitable Communities led the enterprise-wide collaborative efforts to revise Board Policy A-128 to incorporate the Board's guiding principles on addressing homelessness and the revisions centered around the County's Framework for Ending Homelessness to incorporate and capture the County's comprehensive current and future efforts to address and end homelessness. The proposed Sunset Review date change to this Board Policy is attached as Attachments C and D.

ORDINANCE NO.	(N.S.)
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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE RELATING TO THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY GENERAL RELIEF PROGRAM

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 264 of the San Diego County Administrative Code is amended as follows:

SEC. 264. SPONSORSHIP REPORTING-OF INDIGENT ALIENS

Whenever any application for General Relief is approved on behalf of any alien sponsored person who is not a citizen or national of the United States who is or has been a recipient of General Relief during the three-year sponsorship period, the Director shall report such facts and the sponsor's information to the Citizenship and Immigration Services of the United States Department of Homeland Security and request that further investigation and action be taken by that office.

Section 2. Section 265 of the San Diego County Administrative Code is amended as follows:

SEC. 265. RESIDENT CITIZENSHIP AND LAWFUL ALIEN STATUS

No General Relief shall be granted to an applicant or recipient household unless the applicant or recipient is (1) a United States citizen, (2) if not a citizen, lawfully admitted to permanent residence-in the United States. This does not apply to dependent children of the court.

Section 3. INTENT. The intent of this ordinance is to align the San Diego County Administrative Code with the State's removal of the word "alien" from all California code sections. The changes in this Ordinance are intended to be non-substantive and shall not expand or reduce eligibility criteria or requirements.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption. Before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published once with the names of the members voting for and against the same in the San Diego Daily Transcript, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.



 - Initial application and recertification interviews March 31st 2024

California EBT Card Security and Technology Upgrade

Community Based Organizations Informational Notice

The California EBT Project, in partnership with the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) and our EBT Vendor, Fidelity Information Services, Inc. (FIS), will be providing new tools to allow our cardholders self-service features that will assist in protecting the benefits on their CA EBT Card from fraudulent use. There are three major efforts occurring, deployment of new and upgraded tools for our cardholders, upgrades to the Interactive Voice Response (IVR) and upgraded features on the CA EBT Card that will use magnetic chip and tap pay features when using the card.

The first upgrade is coming in the 4th quarter of this year and will provide our cardholders with expanded access and features to protect the benefits on their CA EBT cards. CA will be deploying the FIS ebtEDGE Mobile Application and Web-enabled Cardholder portal. These tools will allow Cardholders to access their card information, and modify access using new features.



New PHE Unwinding Flexibilities

- Suspension of requirement to apply for unconditionally available income (unemployment, disability, veterans, etc.)
- Suspension of Medical Support Enforcement requirements (absent parent)
- Stable income waiver eliminates the need to verify stable income sources during renewal (Social Security, retirement, disability, etc.)

Upcoming Changes

- 26-49 Adult Expansion
 - Effective January 1, 2024, Medi-Cal applicants and beneficiaries who are ages 26 to 49 regardless of immigration status will be eligible to Full Scope benefits
 - With this expansion, all Medi-Cal applicants and beneficiaries will be approved for Full scope benefits regardless of age and immigration status if otherwise eligible
