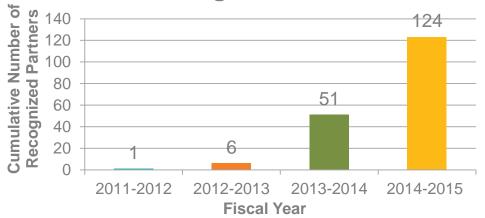




RECOGNIZED PARTNERS BY FISCAL YEAR AND SECTOR



Live Well San Diego Total Recognized Partners

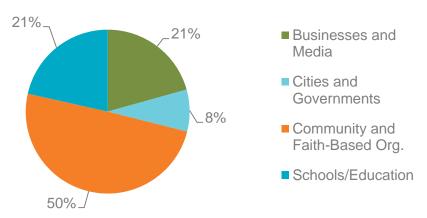

 Internal beta launch to report on progress of Live Well San Diego Top 10 Indicators and related measures, will be available for public use

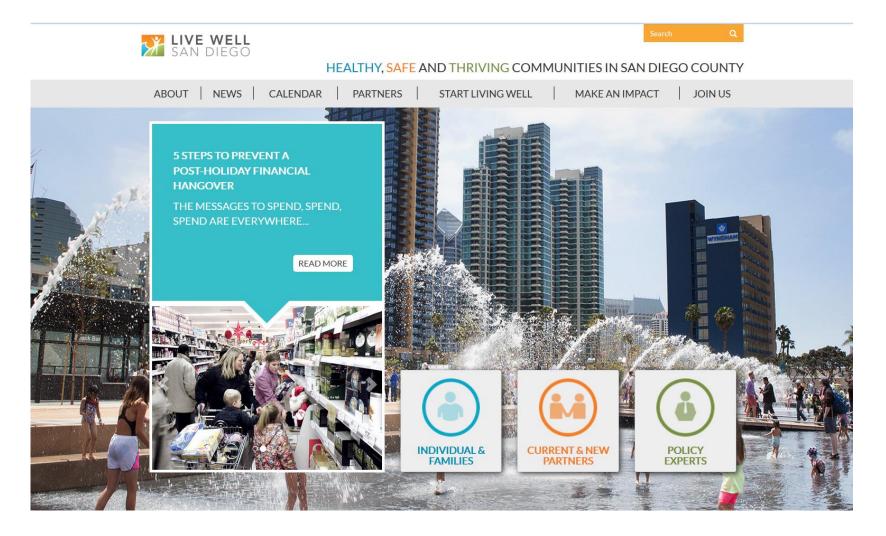
Data Access Portal

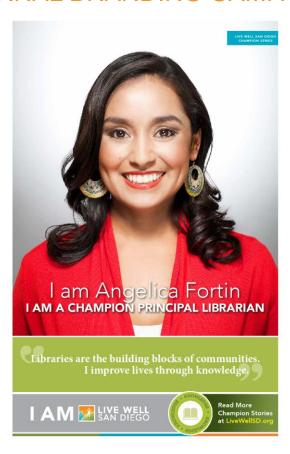

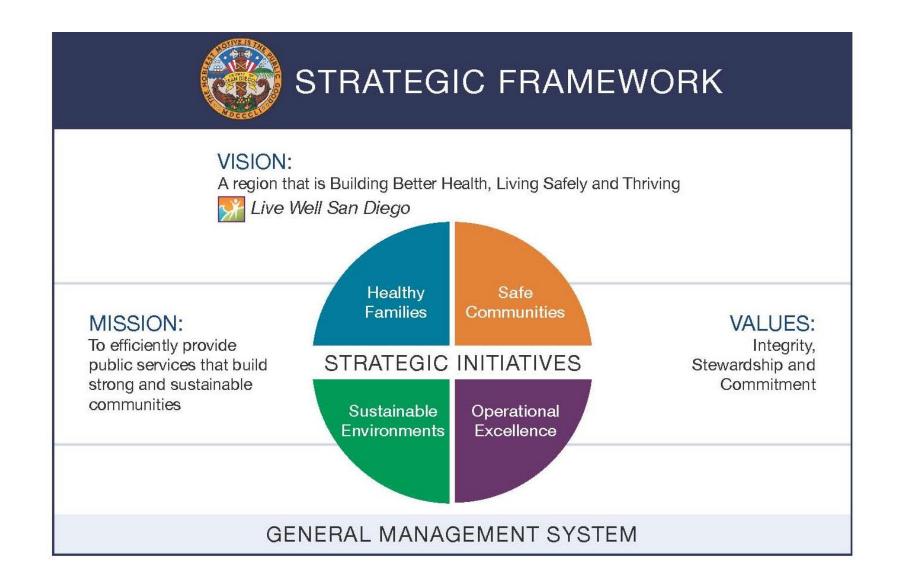
