- January 2016 Point in Time Count revealed **8,692** homeless in San Diego County
 - **4,940** unsheltered
 - **14%** self-identify as having Serious Mental Illness (SMI)
 - **8%** self-report having Substance Use Disorders

	Estimate of Homeless with SMI
January 2015	1,500
January 2016	1,250

COLLECTIVE IMPACT TO ADDRESS HOMELESSNESS



- **Outreach and Engagement:**
 - HOT (Homeless Outreach Teams)
 - IHOT (In-Home Outreach Team)
 - Project In-Reach
 - Homeless Outreach Workers

- **Treatment:**
 - Full-Service Partnerships
 - Project 25
 - Serial Inebriate Project
 - Behavioral Health Court
 - Project 100

- **Permanent Housing:**
 - Additional \$10 million for capital costs
 - Housing 382 veterans and implementing landlord incentive program
 - Permanent supportive housing to 135 families via \$1.8 M through HUD
 - Increasing Housing Choice Voucher Special Local Preference by 300



PROJECT ONE FOR ALL

- Adopted by Board of Supervisors on February 2, 2016
- Establishes County policy that we will provide wraparound services to 100% of people who are homeless and experiencing serious mental illness
- Four key components:
 - Outreach and Engagement
 - Treatment
 - Housing
 - Performance Measurement



WHOLE PERSON CARE PILOT PROJECT

- Established by the Department of Health Care Services through the Medi-Cal 2020 waiver
- Opportunity to create projects linking systems and improving access and care coordination for people who are high utilizers
- Requires 1:1 local match of non Medi-Cal matchable services
- Through December 2020
- Required partners:
 - Health Department
 - Mental Health Plan
 - At least one other public entity
 - At least 1 managed care plan
 - At least 2 community-based organizations



DRUG MEDI-CAL

- Established by the Department of Health Care Services through and amendment to the Bridge to Reform waiver, and continued in the Medi-Cal 2020 waiver
- Expands the number of substance use disorder services that can be reimbursed through Drug Medi-Cal
- Requires counties to “opt-in”
 - San Diego is currently developing a plan, and will bring forward a recommendation for whether to opt in during the Fall



NEXT STEPS

June, 2016:

- Request authority from Board of Supervisors to:
 - Accept the Project One for All Plan (6/21); and
 - Authorize submission of the Whole Person Care pilot application (6/28)

- Fiscal Year 2016-17
- Expand contracts for Project One for All
- If awarded, implement Whole Person Care in January, 2017
- Begin collecting baseline data for both projects
- Determine if San Diego will opt in to Drug Medi-Cal
