Meeting Minutes



Regular Meeting – November 26, 2025 – 3:00 pm (rescheduled from November 19, 2025)

Call to Order – Meeting was called to order at 3:03pm by the Chair

Welcoming Remarks and Introductions

Vote to Approve Meeting Minutes – October 15, 2025

 A motion was made and seconded to approve the October 2025 meeting minutes; committee approved. Julie Neward, Laura Handzel, and Brennan Pearson abstained.

Non-Agenda Comment

- John Brady with Lived Experience Advisors informed the committee that HUD is making changes to appropriation of funding and moving away from permanent housing solutions.
- Jessica informed the committee that federally funded emergency housing vouchers are now being cancelled, and the county has no plans for permanent supportive housing.

 Sergio Padilla expressed concerns regarding paying for handicap parking at forprofit entities and Sentry for Mexico border crossings for medical visits. Requesting literature or legislation for free handicapped parking at for-profit entities.

LiveWell Advance School Summit and Conference Debrief

- Sue informed the committee the session worked out well even though we had fewer attendees than hoped for, but they were engaged.
- Janette informed the committee District Attorney Summer Stephans answered questions and stayed for a while to network afterwards.
- Todd confirmed that feedback from the committee was forwarded to Liz Wellbrock for the LiveWell Debrief session.

Hazard Mitigation Plan - Office of Emergency Services

Working Session – Strategic Focus Areas

- Emergency and Public Safety Accessibility
 - Sue and Laura reviewed the Office of Emergency Service's (OES) Personal Disaster Plan document.
 - Sue emphasized that people with disabilities need to get notified when there are emergencies and recommended everybody sign up for Alert San Diego https://www.alertsandiego.org/en-us/preparedness/alertsandiego.html
 [provided for subscribing].
 - Brennan asked about correlation between Amber alerts, how emergencies are differentiated and whether auditory alerts are an option.
 - Dr. Smith suggested Watch Duty which also has an auditory alert and may synergize with Alert San Diego.
 - Sue pointed out that residents should prepare a Go Kit
 - There are two versions of the County of San Diego OES Personal Disaster Plan
 https://www.alertsandiego.org/en-us/preparedness/make-a-plan.html
 - General version
 - For People Who May Need Assistance version
 - Laura complimented the design of the publication For People Who May Need Assistance but noted that it is lacking a Table of Contents and glossary (which was included in the non-disabled version).
 - Graphics may be overwhelming for some people with sensory sensitivity.

- Laura requested the committee provide input for next version of the publication and recommended various formats such as a shorter version.
- Sue requested screen reader friendly version be available online.
- Dr. Smith recommended a braille version and using Open Dyslexic font for publications.
- Laura is considering including more information for service dogs.
- Consider perforating elements to be pulled from the document
- The committee viewed the companion video for The Personal Disaster Plan https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FrLVJD2ibzA
- Julie offered to share a copy of a manual she created as an example.
- Committee is requested to review and provide input on the Table of Contents and the Brief Overview she has drafted.
- Sue recommended collaborating with the OES Department before the Board of Supervisors and potentially host a workshop at the next Live Well event showing collaboration with OES.
