## **Minimum Qualifications**

#### Applicants must possess the following:

Qualifying candidates will possess a bachelor's degree from an accredited U.S. college university or certified foreign studies equivalency AND five management level experience that demonstrates the ability to perform the essential functions of the classification. Experience must include at least one year of supervision.

**Note**: A master's degree or higher degree may substitute for a total of one year of experience and cannot be applied to the required one year of supervision.

- 4. Attach a copy of your degree, transcripts, or certified foreign equivalency.

A first review of applications will take place the week of March 14, 2024. The deadline to apply is March 28, 2024.

Personal information includes name, phone number, address, gender, age, and race. Hiring managers will only receive the redacted application (without resumes) to determine which candidates they will interview. Resumes will be sent to hiring managers at the time interviews are scheduled.
