

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must possess the following:

Qualifying candidates will possess a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university, or certified equivalency for foreign studies, AND, five (5) years of experience that demonstrates the ability to perform the essential functions of the classification, which must include two years of management or supervision; OR, a combination of experienceand/or education as stated above.

Certification as a CA Registered Environmental Health Specialist (REHS) is highly desirable. Note: A master's degree or higher degree may substitute for a total of one year of experience. In order for education to substitute for work experience as indicated above, college level coursework must demonstrate progress toward a degree and may be substituted on a year-for-year basis.
