

THE POSITION

Veterinarian

Veterinarian is a professional classification that is responsible for providing leadership and direction for the medical and surgical care of shelter animals. The incumbent will primarily perform high-quality spay/neuter surgeries and will also triage a diverse caseload, diagnose a wide variety of medical conditions, develop treatment plans, communicate efforts for the containment of contagious diseases, oversee the distribution and use of controlled drugs and ensure all veterinary work is performed in accordance with State law, County policies and best practices. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, conducting exams, providing routine care, performing surgical procedures, maintaining thorough medical records, advising and training staff, being a liaison with veterinary community partners, managing supply inventory, assisting with the documentation of animal cruelty cases and working in partnership with the Animal Medical Operations Manager (AMOM) to operate within budgetary guidelines while maximizing care and treatment of animals.



DEPARTMENT OF ANIMAL SERVICES

The Department of Animal Services (DAS) is a nationally recognized organization that works to protect animals from abuse and neglect and the public from dangerous animals, and saves the lives of thousands of unwanted, abandoned, or lost pets each year. The Department has 66 full-time staff, two shelter facilities located in Bonita and Carlsbad and an operating budget of \$11.3 million. DAS will soon occupy a newly constructed animal shelter in Santee to replace Bonita and the Director will be responsible for transitioning operations to the new facility. The Department is launching the Pet Health Express, a mobile veterinary clinic, bringing animal services such as microchipping, spay/neuter procedures, disaster preparedness and pet wellness education to underserved areas of the County. The Director will help shape the operational model for Animals Services to incorporate these significant enhancements.

The Department's mission is to protect the health, safety and welfare of people and animals. The Department of Animal Services supports the County's Strategic Initiatives which include Equity, Empower, Justice, Sustainability and Community.

- **Equity** by promoting and conducting vaccination, licensing, and microchipping clinics in the top underserved communities in collaboration with external partners.
- **Community** by partnering with unincorporated communities and using community input to develop an Evacuation Disaster Plan; achieving a goal of 0% euthanasia of any healthy or treatable animals by reuniting lost pets with their owner, through adoption to a new family, or transfer to a rescue partner; and responding to 98% of patrol calls on time.
- **Empower** by continuing to implement business process improvements to enhance DAS' Volunteer Program and increase volunteer and staff engagement.
- Sustainability by applying for grants and partnering with foundations to maximize use of outside funding for DAS.

A degree in veterinary medicine from an accredited university of veterinary medicine.

CERTIFICATION/REGISTRATION:

A valid license to practice veterinary medicine in the State of California, which will be maintained throughout employment in this class, is required at the time of appointment AND Possess or be able to obtain a Drug Enforcement Agency (D.E.A.) controlled substance registration.

Note: Two (2) years of experience in veterinary medicine is highly desirable.

The ideal candidate will be a strong, forward thinking, and innovative leader with outstanding managerial expertise and exceptional oral and written communication skills along with community engagement skills. Their professional history will demonstrate the following leadership competencies, attributes, and experience:

- · Demonstrated experience in shelter medicine
- Ability to empower and motivate others, manage stress and conflict, lay a foundation of mutual respect and trust, and develop staff by encouraging their contributions

- Knowledge of process development and improvement, including innovation in technology
- May present and have conversations with various agencies, community members and advocacy organizations
