- Since 2010, there have been at least 24 deaths in CBP custody.
- In 2015, Customs and Border Protection(CBP) created its National Standards for Transport, Escort, Detention, and Search(TEDS).

TEDs violations observed at open air detention sites in San Diego sector

- Medical assistance
- Regular meals to adults, meals every six hours to children and pregnant people
- Adequate water
- Restroom facilities and cleanliness standards
- Basic hygiene items and efforts to provide showers
- The least amount of time in detention possible - no longer than 72 hours
