







Carlsbad

On 10/20/2024, HIRT responded to a freeway construction site at the Palomar Airport Rd I-5 SB onramp in Carlsbad, where a moisture density gage was broken when a vehicle struck the device operator while holding it.

02/27/2024: HIRT responded to a release of 24 gallons of 35% Hydrogen Peroxide at Ship Calm into a drainage ditch. Per Carlsbad Fire, the chemical was off gassing a white cloud that slowly dissipated and eventually stopped. Building was evacuated.




Chula Vista

- December 2024- HIRT was requested by Chula Vista Fire Department for a
 white powder that was brought to the fire station at 447 F Street by a
 resident in Chula Vista. The resident was concerned about the unknown
 white powder found in their daughter's bedroom.
- July 2024- Chula Vista Fire department contacted HIRT regarding two patients transported to Sharp Chula Vista hospital after experiencing symptoms of headache, nausea, vomiting and stomach ache. They suspected a possible refrigerant release from the refrigerator.

San Diego Police requested HIRT respond to a suspected chemical suicide inside a vehicle on the 15600 Block of San Andres Dr. next to San Dieguito Park.



Encinitas

• On 7/24/2024, HIRT responded to a reported carbon dioxide release inside the Trader Joe's located at 115 N El Camino Real Encinitas.




Oceanside

• On 4/25/2024, HIRT responded to a fire at a structure on the Oceanside Pier.


