FY23 SHSP Reallocation

BACKGROUND

- Starting in FY11 SHSP, a competitive Reallocation process was implemented.
- For FY22 SHSP, a total of \$16,864 was returned to our region
 & funded:
 - Emergency sheltering for pets
 - (2) Specialized Rescue Equipment Packages for large animal rescue,
 - (6) P25 Ballistic Helmets
- The anticipated funds available for Reallocation for FY23 SHSP is \$37,717.



PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Proposed projects have a <u>three-month</u> completion timeframe (November 1, 2025, to January 31, 2026).
- 2. Projects must not require EHP, Aviation, or Watercraft approvals.
- Projects must not require new Sole Sourcing pre-approvals for Project Expenditures that are over \$250,000.

*Requested projects that have a sole source pre-approval in place for the FY23 SHSP will be accepted.
