- Association of Planning Groups: No new information or updates.
- SANDAG: No new information provided.
- I-15 Corridor Design Review Board: No updates presented.
- Traffic Advisory Committee: Reminder provided about the upcoming meeting on June 6, 2025.
- Bonsall Unified School District: Recognized teacher of the year; community pride and acknowledgment noted.

F. ACTION ITEMS:

1. Bonsall Community Park Progress

- Progress update by Chair Anderson detailing improvements and projected timelines.
- Park development progressing on schedule, expected completion is Spring 2026.
- ° Positive community feedback received; continued community involvement encouraged.

2. Equestrian Trail Connection - Guajome Park

- Detailed presentation by Tamara Couzens, Oceanside resident and equestrian, highlighting significant safety concerns crossing North Santa Fe Ave.
- Proposal included dedicated equestrian pathway extending the Santa Fe Trail to avoid traffic risks.
- OBO Board members discussed potential environmental challenges such as stream crossings requiring detailed planning and environmental compliance.
- ° Consensus reached on the importance of prioritizing this safety issue.

3. San Luis Rey Equestrian Hospital Expansion

- Comprehensive review of proposed expansion plans including new facilities and improved amenities for equine care.
- Community generally supportive; some minor concerns about traffic and environmental impacts noted.
- Of General acknowledgment that project would positively enhance local veterinary services and community reputation.

- 4. Innovative Energy Station (H & T Land & Cattle)
 - ° Address: Intersection of Interstate 15 & Old Hwy 395.
 - Extensive and detailed community opposition was presented by several residents:
 - Jack Fox: Raised significant concerns about increased traffic congestion, potential environmental degradation, and negative impacts on local rural aesthetics. Emphasized the redundancy of existing fuel stations already sufficiently serving the area.
 - Sarah Chapney: Highlighted environmental concerns, specifically risks to local wildlife and water runoff impacts, and questioned the necessity of the project given existing infrastructure.
 - Rick Hatcher: Expressed strong objections related to increased commercial development pressure, potential decline in property values, and feared subsequent loss of the area's rural character.
 - Cathy Ollin: Noted inconsistencies with community planning documents emphasizing rural preservation, criticized potential light and noise pollution, and raised safety concerns with increased truck traffic near residential zones.
 - Peter Darsey: Provided detailed points about inadequate infrastructure such as sewer and water services to support such a facility and raised specific safety concerns around proximity to residential neighborhoods.
 - Approximately 22 community members explicitly stood in opposition to the project.
 - No attendees spoke in support of the project.
 - ° The Board recognized the community's strong consensus and seriousness of the concerns raised.
- 5. Congressional Surface Transportation Reauthorization Act
 - Steve Norris presented details of the act and potential benefits for local infrastructure

- Board agreed on importance of advocating for local needs through Congressman Issa's office
- Motion by Steve Norris to support sending a letter of endorsement to Congressman Issa's office.
- ° Seconded by Mike Collier.
- VOTE: Passed unanimously (Anderson, Rowley, Collier, Haider, Norris all Aye; Van Leeuwen absent).

6. BCSG Standing Rules Review

- ° Chair Anderson reviewed current rules, noting several areas requiring updates.
- Members agreed on a detailed review to identify specific changes.
- ° No immediate decisions or votes; ongoing review scheduled.
- VOTE: Passed unanimously (Anderson, Rowley, Collier, Haider, Norris all Aye; Van Leeuwen absent).

7. Seat #2 Candidate Review

- ° Candidates: Dorothea Flanigan and Sophia Kittell.
- Discussion included review of applications and qualifications provided by candidates.
- Jennifer Haider formally nominated Sophia Kittell, seconded by Mike Collier.
- Questions and Discussion followed regarding candidate qualifications, community involvement, and alignment with group values.
