Sheriff's Dept. is the lead agency for Fire Evacuation. As our population grows, they will need more funding to ensure that Fallbrook and other towns are adequately served. They may also play a role in the Cannabis Program that appears to be heading for adoption.
19. PLANNING GROUP BUSINESS:

CHAIR: Consider changing Parliamentary Procedure to Rosenberg's Rules of Order. Non Voting.
Rosenberg's Rules of Order provide a simplified framework for conducting orderly meetings, designed specifically for local government and small boards in California to replace the complexity of Robert's Rules of Order. The rules emphasize efficiency through a 10-step process for handling motions, allowing for "friendly amendments" and limited simultaneous motions to ensure fair, efficient decision-making.

Key Aspects of Rosenberg's Rules:

 - *The Motion Process: A motion is made by a recognized member, seconded, and then discussed. The chair should restate the motion before voting.*

- *Order of Precedence: Only three motions can be on the floor at once (main motion, amendment, and substitute motion).*
- *Voting and Abstentions: Generally, a majority passes a motion. However, in some, more restrictive interpretations of Rosenberg's, an abstention can have the same effect as a "no" vote, particularly if the rules require a majority of those present rather than those voting.*
- *Role of the Chair: The chair maintains neutrality, speaks last in debates, and ensures public comment is heard before final votes.*
- *Friendly Amendments: Unlike Robert's Rules, Rosenberg's allows for "friendly amendments" to be accepted by the maker of the motion without a formal vote.*
- *Reconsideration: A motion to reconsider must be made at the same meeting or the very next meeting by someone who voted with the majority.*

These rules are widely used by city councils, boards, and commissions to keep meetings concise while ensuring democratic, transparent procedures.
