The bond will be in the \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000 range. Public opinion was given; residents asked if there are any plans to reopen the local school. It was also proposed that Jacumba school be utilized as a college providing general/adult education and/or vocational/apprentice training. It was noted that an educational facility in Jacumba would create jobs and generate tax revenue for the area.
