

**JAMUL DULZURA COMMUNITY PLANNING GROUP
FINAL MINUTES
NOVEMBER 12, 2019

1. **Dan Neirinckx, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.**

2. **ROLL CALL:**

3. **APPROVAL of the agenda for November 12, 2019 and the minutes for the meeting of October 22, 2019. Motion passed unanimously.**

4. **OPEN FORUM:**

a. Michael Casinelli reported that the completion date for the installation of the traffic signal at Lyons Valley Rd. and Jamul Dr. may be delayed until January 2020 because of a material shortage.

b. Eve Nasby reported that she would post information concerning the November 16th Bicycle Race in the Jamul Dulzura area on the CPG's Facebook page.

c. Preston Brown reported on the AgriTourism Ordinance changes. The changes would allow for no permit sales of produce grown on County A-72 zoned parcels, this would include Boutique Wineries.

d. Mike Stewart, a prospective new member for the CPG had questions on how the CPG conducted business and its areas of responsibility. It was recommended that as a start he read the Board of Supervisor's Policy I-1 which is available online. Also suggested was to continue to attend CPG meetings.

e. Dan Neirinckx also provided SDG&E information on East County power line safety upgrades starting in November/December for an estimated 12 month project that will run from just Southeast of Manzanita Way, then crossing Barrett Lake Rd and then eastward to Buckman Springs Rd.. This will be posted to the CPG Facebook page.

5. **PDS2018-MUP-18-023, and PDS2018-RP-18-001, Cottonwood Sand Mining.**

Michael Casinelli reported that he attended the Public Scoping Meeting presented by the San Diego County Department of Planning and Development Services (PDS) on November 4th. The County had decided to hold the public meeting to provide: 1. preliminary project information, 2. Educate on how the CEQA process works, and 3. Explain how the County project processing works and how CEQA fits in. Mining

operations would take place from 7:00 am to 5:00 pm week days and material sales from 9:00 am to 3:30 am weekdays, no operations on weekends. The Major Use Permit would apply to about 251 acres. The overall project would be completed in about 12 years.

6. **SAVE OUR SAN DIEGO COUNTRYSIDE INITIATIVE.** The Planning Group Members discussed the effects that the Initiative might have on the Board of Supervisor's Policy I-1. Finding no indication of a change in the CPG's ability to carry out its mission as provided in Policy I-1, **the CPG will make no further comments on the issue.**
7. **JDCPG OFFICER'S ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REPORTS.** Dan Neirinckx, Chair, informed the members that the next regularly scheduled meeting on November 26, 2019 may be cancelled if no action items are necessary.
8. **Jamul Casino Update.** Michael Casinelli reported that on November 13, 2019, the Appeals Court in San Francisco would be hearing the suit which challenges the rights of the Jamul Indian Village that would allow them to conduct Casino activities. In addition, the lawsuit on behalf of Karen Toggery and Walter Rosales charging violation of laws related to native burial sites will also be heard at that time.
9. **ADJOURNMENT:** The Chair adjourned the meeting at 8:20 pm.
