# 4. Open Forum

- Lucille Hargraves appointment has been approved by the BOS. She attended Community Planning Group Training so she is now seated.
- STACK Jamul Fence, SD County PDS sent a scoping letter to Talyer Shakoski. "Planning & Development Services (PDS) has reviewed the application for an Administrative Permit and has provided him with the attached package of information as a guide for further processing the application. A list of project issue(s) were identified during the project scoping These issue(s) may require substantial redesign of the proposed project or, if not resolved, would result in a recommendation for project denial by PDS." There is no action for the JDCPG at this time.

### • Re: Firewise Community:

<u>Firewise USA Site Recognition</u> - Crest Northeast has become the first community in their subregion to receive official recognition as a Firewise USA site and the 11th such site in San Diego County by the National Fire Protection Agency. This recognition marks a significant step forward in enhancing wildfire preparedness and resilience for residents in Crest Northeast.

The Firewise USA Program provides a framework to help communities reduce wildfire risks by implementing proactive mitigation efforts and fostering collaboration among residents, fire agencies, and emergency management organizations. Communities that earn the Firewise USA designation commit to reducing wildfire hazards through education, defensible space initiatives and proactive home hardening measures.

Benefits to residents of Firewise USA sites include increased wildfire safety where Firewise USA communities develop strategies to minimize fire risks, making them better prepared to withstand and recover from wildfires; community collaboration that fosters strong relationships between residents, local fire departments and emergency services to enhance coordinated wildfire response efforts; potential insurance benefits as some insurance providers recognize Firewise USA communities and may offer policy discounts for homes in designated areas; and access to expert wildfire mitigation experts to include resources and best practices to strengthen their resilience.

Going forward, the Jamul Fire Safe Council is now working with two Jamul communities to achieve this same Firewise USA site recognition. These communities include Wood Valley and Lyons Creek. At our upcoming March 18th Jamul-Dulzura Community Planning Group Meeting, the Jamul Fire Safe Council will be reviewing progress they have made with Wood Valley and Lyons Creek in achieving Firewise USA site recognition as well as the steps other Jamul and Dulzura communities can start taking to gain the Firewise USA designation. Come on out to our March 18th meeting either in person or through Zoom to learn more!

Genasys - San Diego Regional Public Safety agencies have come together to announce that all emergency alerting and mapping will be managed by Genasys EVAC. This technology will help emergency managers and dispatchers send out more precise location alerts during an evacuation and help keep San Diegans safe and informed during an emergency. Residents are strongly encouraged to sign up for Genasys alerts to receive timely emergency notifications. Registration is simple and can be done online at AlertSanDiego -

- <u>Cannabis EIR</u>: the County of San Diego Planning & Development Services (PDS) is pleased to announce that the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report (Draft EIR) and draft ordinances for the proposed Socially Equitable Cannabis Program (Cannabis Program) are available for public review in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act.
- The Notice of Availability and draft documents can be viewed on the County's <u>CEQA Public Review website</u>. Printed copies can be viewed at the PDS Project Processing Counter (5510 Overland Avenue, Suite 110, San Diego, CA 92123) and at County library branches. The closest one to Jamul and Dulzura is Rancho San Diego, 11555 Via Rancho San Diego, El Cajon, CA 92019

The Draft EIR identifies and studies potential impacts to the environment from the proposed Cannabis Program, while evaluating ways to avoid or reduce impacts. The draft ordinances include proposed revisions to the County's Regulatory Code and Zoning Ordinance to establish where and how cannabis businesses may operate.

- 6. Wildfire Evacuation Tour with SANDAG and CALTRANS- Highway 94

Vice Chair Paul Dombkowski, APG's Lead Rep will be attending SANDAG's Public Safety Policy Advisory Committee Meeting on February 21st as a member of the public as he has not yet been voted on by SANDAG's Executive Committee and Board of Directors.

New SANDAG Board of Directors has now been elected for 2025. The new Chair is Lisa Heebner, City of Solana Beach; Vice Chair is Joe Lacava, City of San Diego; 2nd Vice Chair is John Minto, City of Santee.

At recent SANDAG January Board Meetings Jan 10, 24, and 31, the 500K+ residents of the Unincorporated Area had no voting representation as the County Board of Supervisors were absent. Note that our APG reps are non-voting at this time - likely their absence is due to Nora Vargas' departure as District 1 Supervisor and SANDAG Board of Directors Chair.

Progress is being made with evacuation/emergency improvements now planned for SR-67. Plan is to add four outbound lanes from Ramona to Lakeside and one inbound lane into Ramona for emergency vehicles. Discussion around SR-94 improvements was also made to potentially add temporary lanes out of Jamul into Rancho San Diego wherever possible. Vice Chair Paul Dombkowski, representing the Jamul-Dulzura Community Planning Group, is to follow-up with Caltrans on this emergency evacuation improvement.

**Ed Mollon** also added that the County had proposed in the past adding bike lanes along SR-94. The CPG's consensus is that this initiative, if implemented, would rule out any

future financing for SR-94 road expansion to support wildfire and emergency evacuation efforts.

# 7. Association of Planning Groups (APG)

Vice Chair Paul Dombkowski (JDCPG representative) is actively working with Jake Stelten, CalTrans SR-94 Project Manager and Tyler Hicks, CalTrans, to progress action items discussed during the recent SR-94 Wildfire and Emergency Evacuation Tour. Both Jake Stelten and Tyler Hicks confirmed that fuel reduction is one of the top priorities for SR-94, to include brush clearing and overhanging tree limb trimming from Rancho San Diego to the SR-188 Tecate turnoff. Current efforts to reduce fuel have been slowed as CalTrans Environmental is still analyzing a large number of cultural sites along SR-94 to ensure their preservation going forward. As soon as this analysis is completed, brush clearing and tree trimming work will begin. Additionally, issues around loop detection light technology freezing due to glare are being investigated by CalTrans' Signal Operations Group. Lastly, to improve overall safety, final details are now being worked out to add a green arrow turn light at Lyons Valley Rd as you turn right onto SR-94. Chair Lisa Hodgson - not asking to widen 94. Asking for a temporary solution for an emergency evacuation.

**Janet Mulder** - If bike lanes are added (\$105 million). The county would not finance road expansion for evacuation.

Thomas Gray - the fire trucks during the border fire were lined up in the parking lot.
