MINUTES of Regular Meeting

Wednesday, March 18, 2026 at 6:30 PM at Rainbow Valley Grange, 2160 Rainbow Valley Blvd, Rainbow CA 92028

- I. Open Provisions
 - A. The meeting was called to order by Chair Kurland at 6:30 PM.
 - B. Pledge of Allegiance
 - C. Attendance: Present: Marty Kurland, Greg Doud, Lynne Malinowski, Jon Gorr, Michele Dahl, Paul Georgantas, Francesca Harris, Frederick Rasp. Excused: Pat Eastman. Late: Ron Ehrler. 8 members being present, a quorum is declared.
- II. Motion to approve the prior meeting minutes from 18 February 2026 by Mr. Rasp, second Mr. Doud, approved unanimously
- III. Public Comments
 - A. None
- IV. Motion to approve of the Order of the Agenda by Ms. Dahl, second by Mr. Rasp, approved unanimously.
- V. Continued Items, Discretionary Projects and County Action Items
 - A. County Roadside Vending Draft Ordinance – Discussion but no action taken. It was noted that there is no Code Enforcement on weekends when some violations may occur.
- VI. Old Business and Reports
 - A. Announcements and Correspondence Received – Chair Kurland on the recent Quarterly Chairs Meeting. Topics: County’s Climate Action Plan, Streamlining Housing Projects, General Plan to increase housing, State involvement in VMT, and Cannabis program.
 - B. Architectural Subcommittee – Ms. Malinowski. Nothing new.
 - C. Social Media and Membership Subcommittee – Ms. Malinowski reported that the Agriculture Sustainability program meeting was posted on Facebook.
 - D. Parks and Beautification Subcommittee – Ms. Dahl. Nothing New.
 - E. I-15 Corridor Design Review Board – Mr. Doud reported that there were no new projects.
 - F. Roads and traffic status – Chair Kurland. Ms. Malinowski reported that the Rainbow Heights Rd 30mph speed limit implementation should occur in mid-April.
 - G. Water and Environmental Issues Report – Chair Kurland. Nothing new.
 - H. Community News and Grange – Ms. Dahl reported that the Grange has established a Welcoming Committee for new Rainbow residents to give information on the community and provide some local gifts. Upcoming Grange events: Potluck 3/22/26, Protea Festiva 4/26/26, 5/2/26 Pancake Brunch with free to firefighters.
 - I. Cannabis and Social Equity Program update – Mr. Doud reported that the final PEIR was published but not yet reviewed. There has been no response to the letter which was sent last month.

Purpose of Planning and Sponsor Groups: Advise the County on discretionary projects as well as on planning and land use matters that are important to their community.

- J. Vallecitos School District Update – Chair Kurland. New music teacher left. Career Day on 3/27/26.
- K. Fire Safety Council Update – Mr. Doud reported that 250 reflective address signs have been sold (more than all other County Fire Safe Councils combined.) The signs are still available, and are being advertised. Next chipping event on 3/28/26 at 1630 S. Mission.
- L. APG & SANDAG Advisory Seat for Unincorporated Communities – Ms. Malinowski reported that there hasn't been a recent message sent out on the meeting recap. A question was asked about the status of the voting seat for SANDAG: the APG chair has been working with State legislators to achieve the correct language in a future bill to allow it.
- M. County Code Enforcement – Mr. Doud. Nothing new.
- N. Signs in the Rights of Way – Mr. Doud reported that large real estate signs are impermissible, but small yard sign types are allowable.
- O. Member/Administrative Reports – Chair Kurland. Nothing new.
- P. SDGE Pressure limiting station project recommendations follow up - Ms. Malinowski reported that the project is no longer required to be discretionary because it is a utility. She contacted the SDGE project engineer who stated that our recommendations were being addressed in the final design, including all lighting to recede down and that Greenscaping will be implemented during the site restoration.

VII. New Business

- A. Rainbow Green Streets Project follow up – Ms. Dahl reported that the project is moving ahead of schedule and is expected to be completed by the end of May, with a plant establishment period of about 6 months afterwards. She provided information on the status of each of the 7 sites, 2 of which are completed.
- B. Approval of Reimbursements for name plates
 - i. Motion to approve reimbursement to Mr. Rasp for \$65.47 by Ms. Dahl, second by Mr. Doud. 8 AYE, 0 NAY, Mr. Rasp abstain. Motion passed.
 - ii. Motion to approve reimbursement to Ms. Malinowski for \$11.84 by Mr. Rasp, second by Mr. Doud, 8 AYE, 0 NAY, Mr. Rasp abstain. Motion passed.
