1. CALL TO ORDER BY CHAIRPERSON JIM COOPER AT 7:00 p.m.

4. Corrections/Approval to T&T Minutes December 18, 2018. Motion to approved as submitted made by Lynn Hopewell, seconded by Dan Summmers. Motion passed 4-0-0-0

6. PRESENTATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS ONLY – None

7. ACTION ITEMS:

a. Ramona Community Protection and Evacuation Plan (CPEP) – Discussion on concerns from members, Section E.

Still awaiting a response to the RCPG letter requesting copys of any/all studies related to road capacities on Hwy-67.

Motion to table made by Ken Brennecke, seconded by Lynn Hopewell. Motion carried 4-0-0-0

b. Review of Ramona Resurfacing List 2018-2019. Roads resurfacing comparison between the County recent list and the proposed list from the RCPG last year.

The Chairperson handed out the results of the T&T sub-cmte roads review developed in March 2018 and as approved/submitted by the RCPG to the County. This list was divided into three categories: 13 were High priority, 7 were Medium Priority, and 10 were of Low priority totaling 30 roads desiring resurfacing actions by the County for 2019.

The County list for action in 2019 listed 22 roads for resurfacing action in 2019. Of these, 4 were approved from the RCPG High Priority list, 1 was approved from the Medium priority list, and 10 were approved from the Low priority list.

Thus 17 of the RCPG's 30 identified roads list were approved by the County for road resurfacing in 2019. Note that some roads geographic clustering exists as it lowers construction costs when the County can complete a number of road projects near each other while the construction equipment is localized.

Details are provided in attachment A.

A motion was made by Lynn Hopewell, seconded by Dan Summers to forward this report to the RCPG as an information item. Motion passed 4-0-0-0

c. Presentation by the Highway 67 Ad Hoc Committee of the RCPG, to get Highway 67 moved up on the Regional Transportation Plan to before 2036—2050, as is currently proposed.

The AdHoc Committee created under the RCPG has worked very hard to collect support from a great number of influential individuals and groups, and to develop a briefing to support the RCPG's interests in moving construction improvement into a near-term timeframe under the SANDAG scheduling system.

This presentation, by Dan Summers, was made to collect constructive comments from the T&T sub-cmte members in order to enhance the presentation.

The presentation began with an admission that this briefing was entirely drafted that afternoon (Tuesday) and was not what the AdHoc had agreed upon to date.

The topic has been approved as an agenda item for the upcoming SANDAG transportation Committee for their meeting scheduled for February 15<sup>th</sup>. And if a brief time would be allowed, it would probably be limited to about ten minutes.

The support story boards included a full array of the slides demonstrating the Ramona communities concerns about Hwy 67, a large map showing the curve between Cloudy Moon and Rock House Rd., and a large map covering Hwy 67 from the intersection of Highland Valley/Dye Road to the intersection of Hwy 67 and Poway Rd.

The T&T members present were Ken Brennecke, Lynn Hopewel, Jim Cooper, and Dan Summers. Also in attendance was Casey Lynch. No others attended.

The overall presentation took 17 minutes, with 6 minutes used for the introduction.

The following thoughts were shared by and with the presenter:

Community concerns focus on #1 Evacuation, #2 Safety, and #3 Mobility.

Some mentions of the Evacuation problems from 2003 and 2007. Real facts regarding the proven road limitation needs emphasis. Comparison to Paradise Fire need careful couching... The potential "chimney effect" of a fire coming up from the Doz Picos park area and trapping traffic-locked vehicles at the curve needs possible attention...

Time spent on the fact that Ramona has no public transportation systems (like Vista and Santee) with an indication that without attention to Hwy 67 "We are not going to make it!" twice emphasized... a comment about this being a waste of valuable presentation time.....

12 minutes into the presentation, discussion seems to end with a strong pitch for a solid median barrier between Cloudy Moon and Rock House Rd (leaving one member believing that the whole pitch was for the median barrier), and then the presentation continued with attentions on the need for improvements to Hwy 67 between Highland Valley/Dye Rd and Poway Road. The presenter admitted that he was interested in getting "a second bite at this apple"... Comment made that this is a serious distraction to the 'identified focus of this effort': to move the current schedule for Hwy 67 improvements to an earlier date than 2036-2050. Comment made that this was a "settled issue", why was it being re-emphasized??

At the end, less than 2 minutes was focused on the selected section for needed help, that this segmenting off from the overall Hwy 67 from Lakeside to Ramona was suggested by both CalTrans and Sandag staff, that the four phases were identified to better gain near term financial support, that the phased selections would best fit both the overall evacuation policy of outward to inward problem solutions as well as help gain financial support. A comment was made that this is the crux of the presentation and needs to be at the beginning and at the end... To little to late as the center of the community concern..... and did not emphasize the help from CalTrans and Sandag staff in reaching these conclusions...

An attendee asked why this presentation was not reflecting a need for five phases versus the four?? The fifth would be from the Highland Valley/Dye Road intersection to the beginning of the four lanes at Litten and Main?

found a couple of additional thoughts from notes:

Casey mentioned that a part of the Hwy 67 problem in the area of Mobility and Safety has to do with the frequent changes from two to four back to two back to four, etc. lanes which causes the traffic to continually bunch up and then free up, etc...

The focus on Hwy 67 is based upon the fact that other routes - Wild Cat Canyon, and 78 both ways out of town have all been blocked by wildfires where as Hwy 67 has historically remained the GO-TO evac route for Ramona to include the SDCE.....

NOTE” As time is of the essence the above information was shared with the Hwy-67 AdHoc committee direct on 1 23 2019 for use as they might see fit.

8, Concerns from Members. A member asked about the status of the parking lot off of Mt Woodson. Casey Lynch indicated that some progress was being made...

## ATTACHMENT A

The following represents a review of the Ramona Resurfacing List 2018-2019 as proposed in early 2018 and the most recent County list as provided in January 2019.

### Background –

On 5 Oct 2017, the Chairperson of the RCPG received an email with the subject of COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO ANNUAL ROAD RESURFACING PROGRAM UPDATE that included a listing of roads **distributed for review and comment.**

During the RCPG meeting of 2 November 2017, and AdHoc committee was created by the RCPG under the T&T Sub-Committee to accomplish this task. Membership was Jim Cooper, Dawn Perfect and David Stone, all current members of the T&T sub-cmte.

During the T&T Sub-Committee's meeting on 28 November 2017, the Chairperson RCPG delivered a letter from the San Diego County DPW dated 7 November 2017 entitled **PRIORITIZATION REQUEST FOR ROADWAY PAVEMENT MAINTENANCE IN THE RAMONA COMMUNITY PLANNING GROUP (CPG) AREA.** No action was taken at that T&T sub-committee meeting other than develop a suggestion that the standing AdHoc committee take this for action if approved by the upcoming RCPG meeting of 7 December 2017; which was granted.

Also since this deadline was 45 days from the date of the letter, a formal request was made and supported for an extended deadline of early March 2018.

Efforts began to obtain copies of the various related documents to include an exact copy of the roadways map (in color) from the County, which was accomplished and distributed to the AdHoc committee members near the end of December.

A roads listing for those within the SDCEs was sent to the prior SDCE support person that helped with the first list also, for input.

The AdHoc committee met on January 6, 2018 and made some final decisions on the prioritized recommendations that they were going to make to the T&T Sub-committee on 23 January 2018, and then to be forwarded to the RCPG, with a goal of having this done for the 1 February 2018 RCPG meeting.

The results were finally reported out at the February T&T sub-committee with final recommendations being presented at the March RCPG. This concluded the chartered action of this AdHoc sub-committee under the RCPG T&T sub-committee, and at that time the adhoc sub-committee was absolved.

The following is the finalized prioritized listing of roads recommended for resurfacing by the County broken down into three categories:
