The proposed project is a new wireless telecommunications facility to be installed on an existing light pole near the athletic fields at Ramona High School, and the installation of an equipment area near the light pole. The AT&T antenna top height is 63'-9" on the 80'-7" light pole. The RCPG approved this project on 9-2-21. The County requested the applicant stealth the project, and it is coming back for RCPG review of the stealthed facility.
