Appendix VCCPG August 9, 2021 Minutes

Agenda Item E (Public Comments) and G.(2) (Cannabis Subcommittee)

1. Chair Chavez described how she and PG Members Schmidt and Adams, along with representatives from Supervisor Desmond met with SDG&E. She indicated that good progress had been made in encouraging SDG&E to continue providing details of their prior and future actions. After explaining that the VCCPG is an advisory body only, she felt an obligation to provide more information to the community and had requested that SDG&E attend the meeting. She encouraged filing of claims with SDG&E if needed; doing so does not remove any other legal options.

SDG&E representatives Todd Vorhees, Ted R. and Matthew H. gave updates on the work at Cole Grade Road & Cool Valley Road. On June 30 they filled the pits and stopped dewatering. The preliminary report from an arborist hired by SDG&E says local species were not affected by SDG&E actions; a dying oak tree near the site was suffering from a pre-existing beetle infestation. They have opened a hydrologist's study to see if the water can be returned to the local aquifer and expect results in 2-3 months.

SDG&E estimated that 2.5 - 3.75 Million gallons of water were removed from the site. Initially some was taken to a recycling site near Los Angeles, much of the rest was taken to the reservoir of a local farmer who had permits allowing the deposits.

The method they used for "Jack & Bore" was chosen because it was more suited to the undergrounding distance of 450'; an alternate method of "Horizontal Directional Drilling" was more appropriate for distances beyond 1000'.

Re-introducing the water may require treatment, soil studies and more knowledge of local drainage conditions.

Local residents asked for a copy of SDG&E's geological report. They also spoke of concerns with the loss of water in their wells and local creek bed, expressed concern about the bias of the consultants hired by the company and were reluctant to trust the company's information going forward since they felt that SDG&E had not been truthful up to that point.

- 2. Mr. Arant provided a short explanation on how the Valley Center Municipal Water District operates and noted that there is no direct involvement with this SDG&E operation.
- 3. Two audience members expressed their concerns about changes that the Board of Supervisors are considering for County-permitted cannabis dispensaries; the Planning Commission had voted in favor of 3 out of 4 points on the proposed changes (expansion to 10,000 square feet being the exception). Residents were encouraged to attend the

upcoming meetings on August 17 & 18. An October decision is expected on allowing the five existing dispensaries to operate beyond April 2022, recreational sales of cannabis and commercial sales of related items and a transfer of the operating certificate.

Later in the meeting, during Item G.(2) discussion, Dr. Mathews reiterated that cannabis remains illegal under Federal laws, adding to confusion and concern about County actions. Federal changes to cannabis restrictions are being considered but have not advanced at this point. Feedback at recent Board of Supervisors meetings has been mostly negative toward the considered changes.

Item F.(5) (Public Works Priority List)

1. A presentation by County staff illustrated how this list was intended to address new needs rather than repaying or other maintenance. Issues could range from online resources to road reconstruction, bridge repair, drainage, traffic signals and more.

Item F.(6) (VC Community Plan Update) and G.(7) (Community Plan Subcommittee)

Mr. Hutchinson reported on the Subcommittee's July 28 meeting with the County PDS. The
meeting was not directly about the VC Community Plan Update and focused on the parallel
effort to change land designations within four subzones within the VC region. There were
three options offered for each of the four subzones, covering changes that would either
decrease or increase allowed density. The deadline for public comments would expire on
August 18.
