Thank you for allowing me to make comments to this Draft EIR.

First of all there needs to be a freeway interchange at the northeast area of the project. There is a Deer Springs Fire station at Circle R road. If there is a fire, or an emergency or health issue call and that is the engine that needs to respond (others may be tied up with other calls), that engine has to fight the traffic all the way down Lawrence Welk Road to Deer Springs Road just to get to a home in the northeast part of the project which is the Mesa neighborhood. They have to go down Champagne Boulevard all the way through the I-15 Interchange area, travel to Deer Springs Road, then onto Mesa Rock Road and then enter the project at that point and drive all the way to the Mesa Neighborhood, when they could have just cut into the project at the northeast corner saving many minutes.

What would the response time be with the project as is, in this scenario?

In the above scenario what would the response time be? I do not believe it can be achieved in 5 minutes.

What would the response time be with an entrance at the Northeast corner of the project?

That the homeowner would have to have someone hook them up? Or does it mean that they are hooked up and ready to go?	I-34-14
"Every garage will have an electric vehicle charger". Do they mean wired for, or do they mean operational?] I-34-15

"Single family homes will be pre-plumbed for grey water systems". First of all I see the word "systems". Then I wonder if they will be operational or not?] I-34-17
The Newland Sierra brochure states: Newland Sierra will <u>FIX</u> Deer Springs Road. What will the road grade be when they <u>"FIX"</u> it? What is the road grade now?] I-34-18
When is the Buena Creek roundabout being built? Is it stated in their brochure that was on our chairs at the County meeting last month that they are "including a roundabout option for the Buena Creek/Monte Vista Drive Intersection".
