

Sustainable Groundwater Management Act

- Signed into law by the Governor in Sept. 2014
- Intent is for groundwater management to be strengthened at local level
- Requires all High and Medium Priority groundwater basins be managed in a sustainable manner
- Local agencies to form GSAs to prepare a GSP for their basin
- GSAs are granted broad authorities





Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA)

- SGMA is a <u>major change</u> in approach to groundwater management
- Requires coordination among groundwater users, specific technical work and management actions
- DWR will act as reviewers and resources
- SWRCB will act as regulators for noncompliant basins








Sustainable GW Management

Prevent "Undesirable Results"

- Must manage the basin to avoid negative changes in:
 - Groundwater Levels
 - Groundwater Storage
 - Seawater Intrusion
 - Degraded Water Quality
 - Land Subsidence
 - Depletions of Surface Water





SGMA Timeline and Activities

Time	Action
June 30, 2017	Formation of GSAs
Jan. 31, 2022	Completion of GSPs
5 Year Updates	Implementation of GSPs under local management, with regular check ins
2040's	Manage Groundwater Sustainably



San Pasqual GSA Filing

- County of San Diego filed GSA in August 2016
- City of San Diego filed GSA in November 2016
- Legal agreement between City and County under development (to be adopted by June 30, 2017)






Memorandum of Understanding

- Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is used to formalize the County/City partnership to sustainably manage the basin
- Documents how the County and City will collaboratively work together
- Establishes a "Core Team" of City and County staff
- Eliminates GSA overlap
- Identifies interagency communication
