Dear Ms. Soffel:

While we support some aspects of the draft Climate Action Plan, we ask that the County add a strong component to reduce the vehicle miles traveled – and thus greenhouse gas emissions – generated from newly planned residential development. The plan should not facilitate far-flung sprawl that undermines the region's efforts to become a carbon-efficient economy. Rather, it is incumbent upon the County to use its land use authority to put in place sustainable patterns of development near jobs and transit, as called for by the State of California.

Buena Creek, Twins Oaks Road, Deer Springs and I-15 and associated traffic lights have been given an F grade. During peak commuter hours, vehicles can be backed up for miles, with waits at traffic lights of 20-30 minutes. That is a tremendous amount of wasted energy and pollution.
