

# **Summary of Cannabis Program**



# **State Cannabis Regulation**

• Permitting of commercial cannabis operations (medical and adult use) is regulated by the California Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) under the California Code of Regulations Title 4, Division 19

#### Cultivation

(growing of cannabis)

#### **Processing**

(harvesting & packaging of cannabis crops)

#### **Testing**

(laboratory analysis of cannabis)

#### Manufacturing

(conversion of raw cannabis to products)

#### Distribution

(transportation of cannabis products)

#### Retail

(sale of cannabis products)

#### **Microbusiness**

(at least 3 activities at one location)

**Temporary Cannabis Events** 

# **Current County Cannabis Regulation**

#### Since 2017, County restricts cannabis operations to 5 existing facilities

Existing cannabis facilities regulated under:

- County Zoning Ordinance (Section 6861 Nonconforming Cannabis Facilities)
- County Code of Regulatory Ordinances (Title 2, Division 1, Chapter 25)

## January 27, 2021:

#### Socially Equitable Cannabis Program

#### Purpose:

- Bring the region in line with the will of San Diego voters
- Establish a pathway for adult-use cannabis access in unincorporated areas
- Provide a new economic opportunity for communities and residents
- Help combat the illicit market
- Help rectify the injustices caused by cannabis criminalization

## January 27, 2021: Proposed Project

# Licensing & Permitting System

- Cultivation
- Retail (including onsite consumption lounges)
- Manufacturing
- Distribution
- Testing
- Microbusiness
- Temporary events

#### **Social Equity Program**

 Provide greater opportunities for individuals negatively or disproportionately impacted by cannabis criminalization to secure a County operating permit

#### Regulatory Requirements

Develop amendments to:

- County Code of Regulatory Ordinances
- Zoning Ordinance

<sup>\*</sup>Cannabis facilities must observe setbacks of 600-ft from state-defined "sensitive uses" (school grades K-12, daycare or youth center)

## June 15, 2022: Project Alternative

#### Board directed additional items for inclusion in the Cannabis Program

- Expand definition of "sensitive uses"
- Increase setbacks to 1,000 feet
- Prohibit cannabis billboards within 1,000 feet of sensitive uses

# **CEQA Process Summary**



# What is CEQA?

### Purpose of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

- Evaluate project's environmental effects
- Reduce significant effects, where feasible
- Public and agency involvement and disclosure
- Informed decision making

If there is a potential for significant impacts, EIR is prepared

Significant impact is a substantial and adverse change in physical environment

# What is CEQA?


## What CEQA does...

- Discloses information about the effects a project could have on the environment
- Identifies mitigation measures
- Describes feasible alternatives to the proposed project
- Solicits agency and public input throughout process

## What CEQA doesn't do...

- Does not require mitigation for existing environmental conditions
- Does not advocate for the project under evaluation
- Does not require project denial due to significant environmental impacts
- Does not address economic and social issues (e.g., property values)

# Tips for Submitting Your Input

Be sure your comments address the CEQA environmental analysis itself rather than simply expressing your opinion of the project

#### Comments are most effective when they are:

- Specific and focus on the scope and content of the Draft EIR
- Relate to the project's potential for impacts on the physical environment
- Include supporting evidence/facts, such as references or citations to specific websites and studies

Comments must be submitted by October 31, 2023, by 5:00 p.m.
