This email is to voice my disapproval of the proposed project(s) referenced in the subject line.

I 144-1

I endorse and agree with comments submitted by Donna Tisdale both as an individual and as a member of the Boulevard Planning Group.

I 144-2

We, the residents of Boulevard, have been disproportionately impacted by industrial-scale projects over the past several years. Proposing even more now is simply adding insult to injury.

I moved to the rural backcountry several years ago to enjoy a more peaceful existence; the starry night skies, the quiet, the wildlife, etc. The existing industrial projects have already negatively impacted my ability to enjoy the meteor showers and night skies due to the red blinking lights distracting and annoying all night long, the growling of the turbines sounds like a jet airplane flying overhead depending on which way the wind is blowing and how close you are to the turbines, and the wildlife I used to see in McCain Valley area has dwindled significantly from what I used to see before the turbines were built. The animals appear to be smart enough to not "live" near these things, but we, as human beings, are expected to tolerate them for "the greater good".

It's not fair. I am a taxpayer and I feel like the decision-makers in San Diego County have let me down. San Bernardino put a moratorium on these type of projects and Humboldt also recently voted against one of these projects. Why can't (or won't) San Diego? Why not produce the energy where it is being consumed... in the the city? There are thousands of parking lots that could benefit from shade structures with solar on top. There are thousands of rooftops where solar could also be installed. The proposed Campo wind turbines are just too big (taller than the tallest skyscraper in San Diego - a whopping 586 feet tall) and I bet no one in the city wants to be in the flicker area, just like we don't.
