

**Response to Comment Letter I111**

**I111-1** The commenter states that the Proposed Project area is a migratory bird path and one of the last nesting areas of the tricolored black birds, and that there are also nesting owls, hawks, golden eagles, horny toads, western tangiers and many other animals that depend on the existing open space to hunt and live. The commenter also states it is sad you would even consider destroying native animal habitat. The commenter further states do not put in this solar because it is in the wrong location and it will kill endangered species. In response, the County acknowledges the commenter's opposition to the Proposed Project. Section 2.3 Biological Resources of the EIR analyzes the Proposed Project's impacts to vegetation communities, wildlife, special status plant and wildlife species, wildlife movement, and migratory bird species. With implementation of mitigation measures (including on-site habitat preservation), all impacts to biological resources would be reduced to less than significant.
