This letter describes the archaeological research and field survey performed for the Lehman Tentative Parcel Map (County Environmental Log No. PDS2020-ER-02-002) property project.

The archaeological survey tasks completed are in accordance with the County of San Diego Guidelines for Determining Significance and Report Format and Requirements for Cultural Resources, the County Resource Protection Ordinance (RPO), and Section 21083.2 of the Public Resources Code (CEQA) and 15064.5 of the CEQA Guidelines. Completed tasks included record searches by the South Coastal Information Center (SCIC), archival research, a review of historic maps of the property, a field survey undertaken by County approved archaeologist and Native American monitor, and preparation of this letter report on the negative findings.

Description:

The project is a Tentative Parcel Map for the division of a 10.28-acre lot into four single-family residential lots. The project site is located at 3600 Linda Vista Drive in the Fallbrook Community Planning area, within unincorporated San Diego County. The site is developed with an existing single-family dwelling unit with attached garage that would remain. Access would be provided by Linda Vista Drive. No extension of sewer and water utilities will be required. Earthwork will consist of cut and fill of 8000 cubic yards of material.

USGS and Regional Location Maps

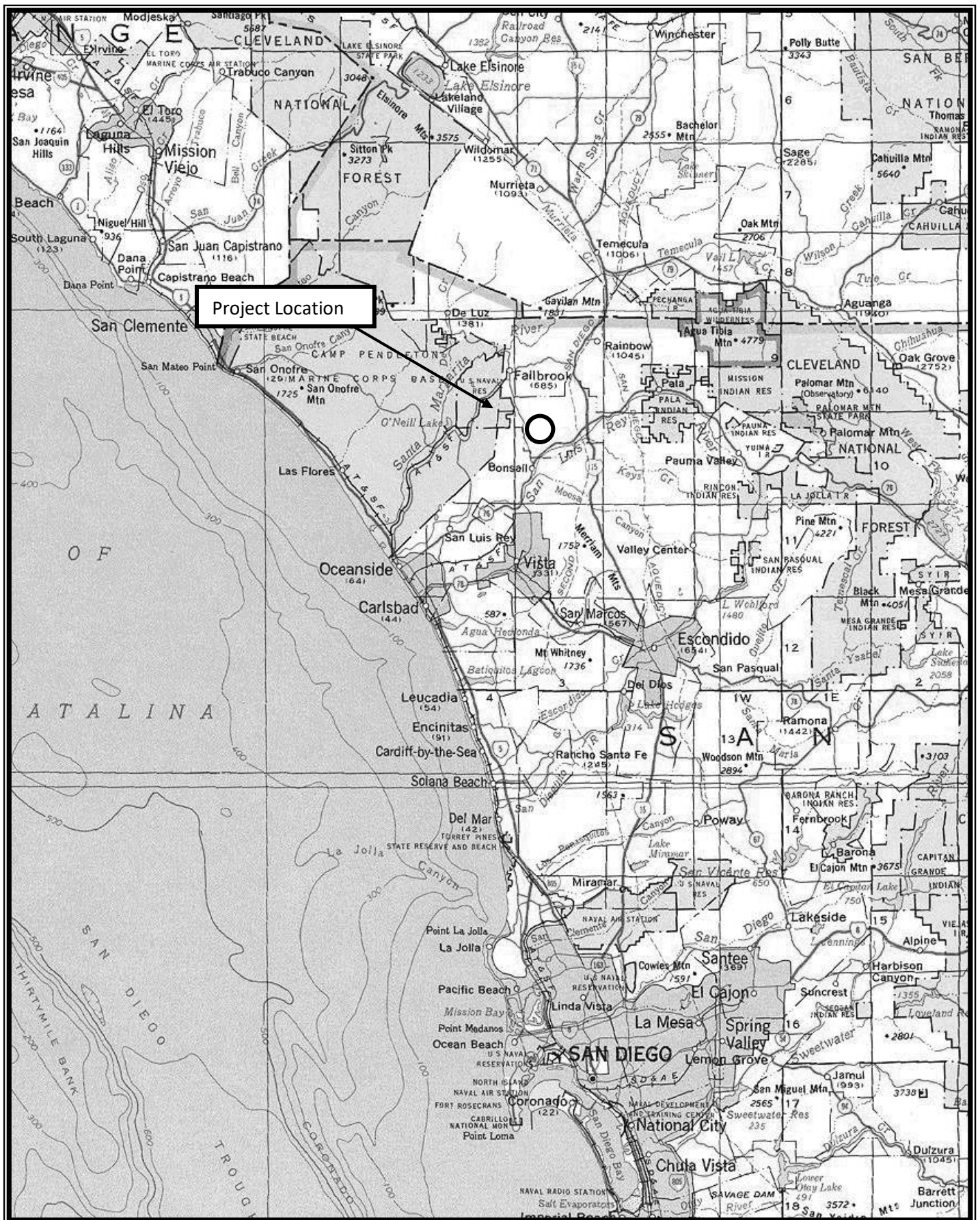


FIGURE 1: PROJECT LOCATION

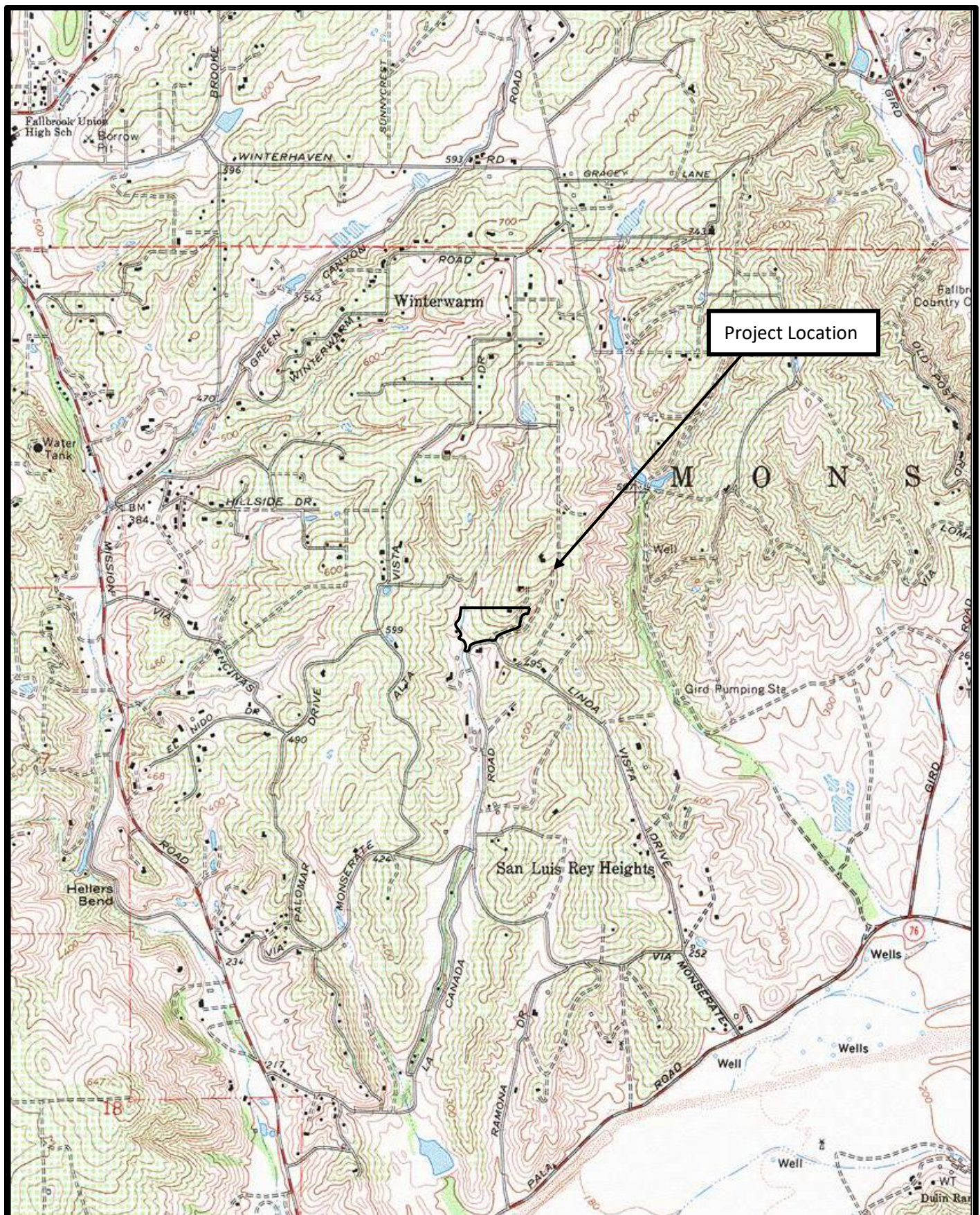


FIGURE 2: PROJECT LOCATION:

Figures 1 and 2 (Attachment 1) identify the project location.

Record Search and Field Survey Results:

Record Search Results

The record search was completed by the San Diego State University-South Coastal Information Center (SCIC) as a virtual appointment under current Covid-19 procedures. A copy of the SCIC Record Search cover letter for the virtual-appointment-one-half mile radius is included as Attachment 2. Seven cultural resource studies have been conducted, all with negative results within the search area. No archaeological or historical resources have been otherwise recorded within the search area.

Historic maps (U.S.G.S. Quadrangles San Luis Rey 1:125,000 (1901), and Bonsall 1:24,000 (1948, 1949, 1968, and 1975)) on file with the author were reviewed as well as 1938 to 1989 historic aerial photographs available on-line. The historic maps reveal that in 1901, no development existed on the north slopes of the San Luis Rey River in the Project vicinity. The historic aerial photographs indicate that the land surrounding the Project was cleared, possibly for hayfields or grazing, by 1938. A house first appears on the property in the 1948 historic map, with a newly-planted orchard first appearing on the 1953 aerial

photograph and appearing to be fully developed from the 1960s to the 1980s. The orchard appears degraded by 1989. According to the property owner, the property was most recently used as a tree nursery but the trees and other vegetation have been graded away for several years. The house on the property recently underwent a permitted remodel and exhibits no evidence of its circa 1948 construction.

Field Survey Results

The field survey was completed August 28, 2020 by Sue Wade of Heritage Resources and Luiseño Native American monitor P. J. Stoneburner of Saving Sacred Sites. The Project property consists of the south-facing slope of a finger between two tributary drainages and is bounded on the north and east by an access drive, on the south by Linda Vista Drive, and on the west by a drainage and residences. Nearly all of the property is terraced with heavily eroded south-flowing gullies and rills prevalent. Exposed light brown silty-sandy soils, some gravel (possibly imported), and a few broken rocks and water-worn cobbles are present. Remnants of prior agricultural activities are present including pipes and piles of removed vegetation. Parts of the west drainage have been altered and parts have eroded to steep and deep vertical walls choked with vegetation. These areas of the creek were impossible to survey. The remainder of the property was surveyed in roughly east/west transects spaced approximately 15 meters apart. No surface artifacts or sites of Native American concern were identified. No historic resources were found. The survey notes page completed by P. J. Stoneburner is included with this letter in Attachment 3.

Sacred Lands Check and Tribal Outreach

A Sacred Lands Check was completed with the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC). The NAHC noted that the search of the Sacred Lands File was positive, suggested contacting Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians for more information, and provided a list of other Native American tribes who may have knowledge of cultural resources in the area. Heritage Resources reached out to six Luiseño tribes (including Rincon), one Cahuilla/ Luiseño tribe, and twelve Kumeyaay Tribes on the list provided by the NAHC. Each was mailed a letter (dated 10/5/2020) and follow up emails were sent (10/31/2020). Five responses were received. The entire set of correspondence and tribal responses is included with this report as Attachment 4.

Conclusions

The archival research and archaeological field survey discovered no archaeological or historical resources on the project property. No significant impacts to archaeological or historical resources, as defined by the County of San Diego Guidelines for Determining Significance and Report Format and Requirements

for Cultural Resources, the County Resource Protection Ordinance (RPO), and Section 21083.2 of the Public Resources Code (CEQA) and 15064.5 of the CEQA Guidelines, are therefore anticipated. Because of the non-depositional geological environment and because of the extensive disturbance and soil erosion on the ridge finger, no archaeological monitoring is warranted or recommended. It is possible that the Luiseño will have additional input during the County's on-going tribal Consultation for the project.

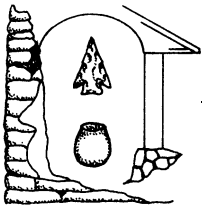

This letter provides you with information on the proposed Lehman TPM Project located at 3600 Linda Vista Drive in the community of Fallbrook, California, and requests any initial input you would like included in the cultural resources survey report being completed for the County of San Diego.

The project consists of 10.28 acres on moderately steep south-facing slopes two miles north of the San Luis Rey River. For most of the 20th century the Project property was cleared agricultural land with an orchard and house developed in circa 1950. In recent years, the property was mechanically cleared and is currently primarily heavily eroded bare-dirt slopes.

A cultural resources survey was completed by a Luiseño monitor from Saving Sacred Sites and myself on 8/28/2020. Given the mostly bare dirt surface, visibility across most of the property was excellent. No archaeological materials were discovered.

As part of the County of San Diego initial review of the proposed Lehman Tentative Parcel Map (County Environmental Log No. PDS2020-ER-02-002) Project, the Cultural Resources study must include a Sacred Lands Check with the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) and results of outreach with listed tribes provided by the NAHC. A Sacred Lands Check was completed with the NAHC and response was received from Mr. Steven Quinn on September 23, 2020. Mr. Quinn noted that the Sacred Lands File check was positive and to please contact the Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians and the San Luis Rey Band of Mission Indians for more information. As well, NAHC provided a contact list of additional Native American tribes who may have knowledge of cultural resources in the project area. I am reaching out to you as you are on this NAHC list.

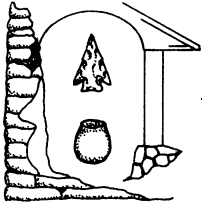

This letter is written on behalf of the Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians ("Rincon Band" or "Band"), a federally recognized Indian Tribe and sovereign government. We have received your notification regarding the above referenced project and we thank you for the opportunity to provide information pertaining to cultural resources. The location identified in the transmitted project documents is situated within the Territory of the Luiseño people and within the Band's specific Area of Historic Interest (AHI). As such, Rincon is traditionally and culturally affiliated to the project area.

After review of the provided documents and our internal information, the Band has specific concerns that that the project has the potential to impact tangible Tribal Cultural Resources (TCRs), Traditional Cultural Landscapes (TCLs), and potential Traditional Cultural Properties (TCPs). Embedded in these resources and within the AHI are Rincon's history, culture, and continuing traditional identity. The Band has knowledge of gathering areas and archaeological sites in proximity to the proposed project site. Based on the information provided above, the Rincon Band recommends for this project:

- An archaeological/cultural resources study be conducted by a Secretary of the Interior qualified archaeologist for this project, to include an archeological record search and complete intensive survey of the property;
- A professional Tribal monitor from the Rincon Band to accompany the archaeologist during the survey;
- A final copy of the study to be provided to the Rincon Band for our review and comment.

The Rincon Band further requests to consult directly with the lead agency regarding project impacts to cultural resources. While it is not the responsibility of the consultant to facilitate State-mandated consultation, the request is included in this letter so the lead agency is aware of the Band's concerns about the project.
