Subject: Intended North San Diego County Commercial Recycling Plant

It has recently come to my attention that a construction debris recycling plant is scheduled to be built just East of I-15 and the Deer Springs area.

This plan did not include input of local residents allowing us to air our concerns. And, how was an Environmental Impact Report deemed not necessary?

As a 17 year resident of North San Diego County (North Escondido County limits) and near the intended recycling site, my concerns are as follows:

- 1. Chemical air pollution, to include asbestos, affecting the health of the residents especially children **many schools** are located in the immediate area of this intended site
- 2. Potential fire danger based on several fires in past few years at similar recycling facilities
- 3. Noise pollution facility hours are planned from 5 am to 7 pm Monday-Saturday based on a minimum of 60 delivery trucks/day
- 4. Increased residential and I-15 freeway traffic/congestion based on a minimum of 60 delivery trucks/day
- 5. Disturbance of the eco system

Based on my above concerns, I'm **against** the currently planned location of this debris recycling plant.

There must be a more practical and safer location for this facility which would not hinder the health of residents
