The County of San Diego (County) acknowledges the commenter's support for the No Project Alternative. This letter expresses the commenter's opposition to the Proposed Project. The decision makers will consider all information in the Final Program Environmental Impact Report (FPEIR) and related documents before making a decision on the Proposed Project. The information in this comment will be provided in the FPEIR for review and consideration by the decision makers. The County analyzed the potential impacts of the Proposed Project on biological resources, including loss of vegetative communities such as chaparral (see DPEIR Section 2.3.3). Based on the environmental evaluation, it was determined that the Proposed Project would have a less than significant impact on biological resources with implementation of mitigation. The remainder of this comment does not relate to an environmental issue or the adequacy of the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report.

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
