## CHAPTER 3.0 ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS FOUND NOT TO BE SIGNIFICANT

## 3.1 <u>Effects Found Not Significant as Part of the EIR</u> Process

According to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, an environmental impact report (EIR) shall focus on the significant effects on the environment (14 California Code of Regulations [CCR] 15143). An EIR shall therefore contain a statement indicating the reasons various possible significant effects were not found significant and not discussed in detail (14 CCR 15128). The following environmental areas were found to be not significant during the EIR process:

- Air Quality (Section 3.1.1)
- Energy (Section 3.1.2)
- Geologic Hazards, Soils, Paleontological Resources (Section 3.1.3)
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions (Section 3.1.4)
- Hazards and Hazardous Materials (Section 3.1.5)
- Land Use and Planning (Section 3.1.6)
- Mineral Resources (Section 3.1.7)
- Public Services (Section 3.1.8)
- Transportation and Traffic (Section 3.1.9)
- Utilities and Service Systems (Section 3.1.10)

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
