Key Points and Importance – Species

Covered Species

- 29 total species
 - 28 currently on endangered species list
 - 1 anticipated to become listed in 50-year permit term
- Species will be “covered” by the County’s Incidental Take Permit
- Projects will not need separate Wildlife Agency take authorization for potential impacts to species on this list
- Projects would demonstrate conformance with the County’s Incidental Take Permit by complying with the Biological Mitigation Ordinance

Watch List

- 14 total species
- None are currently listed on the state or federal Endangered Species List
- Do not currently need take coverage in the North County Plan Area
- Being “watched” because could be listed during the 50-year permit term
- Will be analyzed in the environmental document
- If one of these species becomes listed – projects would need to obtain take authorization for potential impacts to species
- North County Plan has process to move species from watch to covered list

All Other Species

- Either not on Endangered Species List or not within the Plan Area
- Not likely to become listed within the 50-year permit term
- Do not currently and are not likely to need take coverage in the North County Plan Area
- Will be analyzed in the environmental document (EIR/EIS)
