Course Title: Aiding & Abetting Adolescent Brain Development

Instructional Time: 8-hours

Course Description:

The purpose of this course is to provide trainees with an overview of adolescent development and typical behaviors associated with developmental changes. Specifically, trainees will become familiar with changes linked to biology, cognition, social and emotional development. These concurrent changes during this critical developmental period can make youth more vulnerable to engage in risky behaviors and resistant to rules and authority. The presence of additional challenges, such as harmful environmental factors can make adolescents even more susceptible to poor outcomes. Environmental factors such as exposure to substance use, trauma, poverty, and inadequate parenting can adversely affect adolescent development. Strategies for implementing effective behavior management to promote positive youth development within juvenile justice settings will be discussed. These strategies will include skills to create psychological safety, improve communication, which promote overall safety, increase early intervention and deescalation, and increase youth skill acquisition.
