

## Selection Process Timeline

*January-May*

Develop Application, Scoring Methodology, Communications/Outreach Plan, and Promotional Materials

*May 18 - July 31*

**Application Period**

**Public Outreach**

*August 3 - 25*

Clerk of the Board Application Review - Selects the 60 most qualified applicants

*August 26 - September 25*

Post the names of the 60 qualified applicants online for 30 days

*October 13*

**Random Drawing at Regular Board of Supervisors Meeting**

- Prior to Board Meeting, create subpools of names by District.
- At the Board meeting,
  - Conduct a random drawing to select one commissioner from each of the five subpools.
  - Random drawing of all remaining applicants for three additional commissioners.

*October-November*

**Selection Process for Six Additional Commissioners**

- Identify tasks for the eight selected Commissioners to select the remaining six Commissioners.
- Commissioners to meet October 22 and November 5

# County of San Diego 2020-21 Independent Redistricting Commission

## Commission Applicant Requirements

Under California Elections Code, Division 21, Chapter 6.5 (Sections 21550-21553), the County of San Diego Independent Redistricting Commission shall be comprised of 14 members. The political party preferences of the Commission members, as shown on the members' most recent affidavits of registration, shall be as proportional as possible to the total number of voters who are registered with each political party in the County of San Diego or who decline to state or do not indicate a party preference, as determined by registration at the most recent statewide election. However, the political party preferences of the Commission members are not required to be exactly the same as the proportion of political party preferences among the registered voters of the County. At least one Commission member shall reside in each of the five existing supervisorial districts of the Board of Supervisors. Commissioners shall each meet the following qualifications:

1. Be a resident of the County of San Diego.
2. Be a voter who has been continuously registered in the County of San Diego with the same political party preference or with no political party preference and who has not changed the voter's political party preference for five or more years immediately preceding the date of the voter's appointment to the commission.
3. Have voted in at least one of the last three statewide elections immediately preceding the voter's application to be a member of the commission.
4. Within the 10 years immediately preceding the date of application to the commission, neither the applicant, nor an immediate family member of the applicant, has done any of the following:
  - A. Been appointed to, elected to, or have been a candidate for office at the local, state, or federal level representing the County of San Diego, including as a member of the board.
  - B. Served as an employee of, or paid consultant for, an elected representative at the local, state, or federal level representing the County of San Diego.
  - C. Served as an employee of, or paid consultant for, a candidate for office at the local, state, or federal level representing the County of San Diego.
  - D. Served as an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a political party or as an appointed member of a political party central committee.
  - E. Been a registered federal, state, or local lobbyist.
5. Possess experience that demonstrates analytical skills relevant to the redistricting process and voting rights, and possess an ability to comprehend and apply the applicable state and federal legal requirements.
6. Possess experience that demonstrates an ability to be impartial.
7. Possess experience that demonstrates an appreciation for the diverse demographics and geography of the County of San Diego.

An interested person meeting the qualifications specified above may submit an application to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to be considered for membership on the commission. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall review the applications and eliminate applicants who do not meet the specified qualifications.
